Dear Parents and Carers,

Like thousands of schools up and down the country, we celebrated World Book Day on the 7th March! The children had a wonderful day taking part in various book related activities and experiencing a full session with the author Kate Poels.

In that session she led the children through her inspirations and process for character building and developing exciting settings. They looked at classic tales that have been retold through film and animation. Then they finished the workshop by following her process to create their own character and setting for a possible story. All classes followed this up by allowing the children to get their ideas down on paper. It really was a great experience for the children to see this process first hand and actually practice this themselves! We saw and heard some amazing ideas from the children and we hope some have been inspired to read more for pleasure and to even start thinking about creating stories themselves. During the day we had the Maidenhead Advertiser visit and are part of a big article covering World Book Day in local schools that was in last weeks edition - do go and check it out!

In addition to the excellent activities through the day, the children were very creative with their costumes! Whilst this day is not about the dressing up, we really appreciated the effort families put in to take part in this. We wanted to reassure that days like this or other curriculum days the children experience is not about the dressing up, but the experience of the day. So this is a reminder that you do not have to go out and spend money on costumes, there is no pressure for the children to dress up as we just want the children to enjoy the experience of world Book Day and/or other focused curriculum days!

Last week a selection of year 5 children led by Mr Green, continued raising money for Alexander Devine Children's Hospice by selling knitted chick eggs that had a little chocolate treat inside! The children have worked really hard on this and (without knowing the exact final figure) have raised just over £500 for the charity. I think you'll agree, this a great effort for an amazing charity that helps so many children that are suffering through difficult times. The children are very proud of their achievements and rightly so! A big thank you to Mr Green for initiating this project and we will look to continue these projects (just like the Fairtrade campaign) to encourage children to think about issues of responsibility and justice.

Finally, we hope you enjoy the rest of the newsletter, there is a big Sports update which covers the last two weeks of competition, festivals and inter-house tournaments!

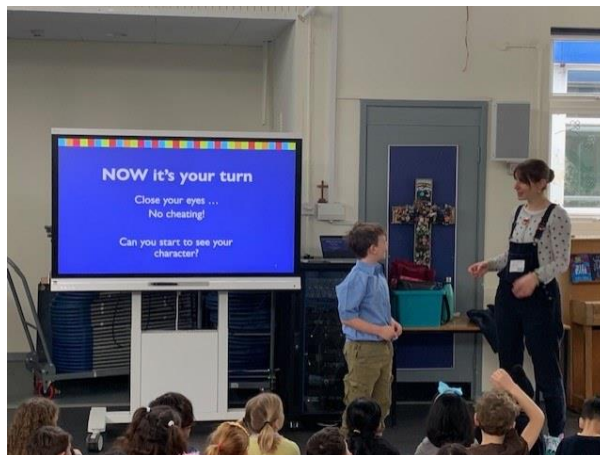

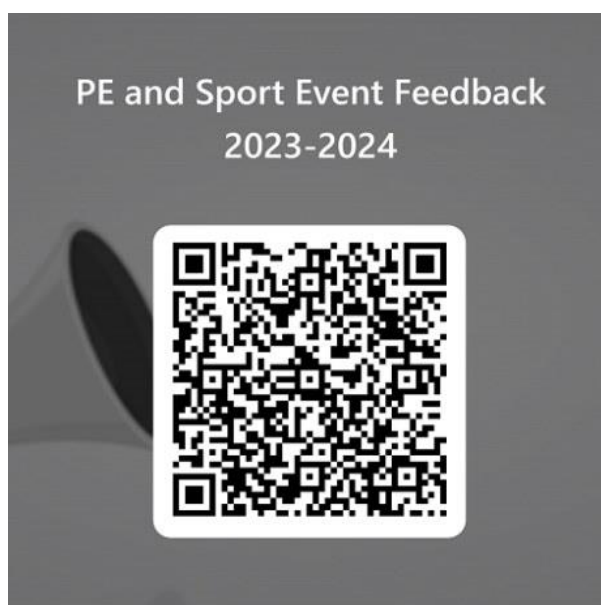

PE Curriculum

Please be reminded PE kit can be worn to school on PE days. After Easter our summer uniform can be worn, and this is expected to be worn for swimming days.

This Spring term each year group are actively concentrating on creative learning behaviours in the core real PE curriculum. In addition to this...

Year 3 have been working on co-ordination – sending and receiving and counter balance with a partner. In the Summer Term Year 3 will be swimming at Braywick and letters are coming home this week.

Year 4 have been involved in the Premier League Primary Stars Programme where a visiting coach works alongside the class teachers offering a PE mentoring service over 6 week blocks. The children were focussing on Dance improvising movements for the circulatory system.

Year 5 Attenborough have returned to Braywick Leisure Centre for more school swimming lessons. It's been amazing to see the improvement the children have made since last year, some now swimming for the first time! PLEASE continue your child's swimming progress by taking them swimming regularly or giving them swimming lessons. It takes regular practice to maintain the achievements they have made in school swimming.

Year 6 teachers have had Dance CPD delivered by Jane Douglass from the sports partnership. She has been really impressed with the children's learning behaviours and this has enabled them to create some wonderful improvisations. Well done year 6, another person you have impressed!

School Grounds Update

Eco Garden Design Competition – deadline Wednesday 27th March

Since the PTA working party initially cleared the fenced Eco Garden at the front of school, we've been raising funds in conjunction with the PTA to redesign the area. Unfortunately, much more needed fundraising is required as we found out from a visiting landscaper!

The Plan

NOW - Design competition for children's ideas.

APRIL - Professional landscaper will use parts of the children's ideas and produce a final design.

SEPT'24 – Initial work will start as this is an evolving project that will depend on funds and man power.

The children will be shown a video of the area in assembly this week. We are asking children to include features they would like in the Eco Garden and create a design on A4 paper. The professional

has explained we would need a water source to maintain a pond, so we have discarded that idea. Other than that, we want to keep it natural and encourage wildlife so get designing and some of your ideas will become real and feature in the new Wildlife Area!

Woodland Trust Trees

The school have had another delivery of trees and we are asking for each class to bring in, bucket sized, plant pots as they will have a better survival rate being watered and nurtured before going into the ground. Each class will be involved in growing the new trees/ hedgerow which will then be planted to enhance the school grounds.

Meadow

At the end of the adventure playground, we have an area which is left to grow into a meadow. Last year, poppies were introduced, but will they appear this season? This year meadow seeds will be added and a figure of eight pathway will be cut for the children to walk around through the meadow without disturbing any wildlife.

The fenced triangle at the other end of the adventure playground, near the weather vein will also be planted with meadow seed.

Allotment

Mrs Nowaczyk and the gardening club are doing a fantastic job growing seeds ready to put in the raised beds, but they are in need of soil.
