We will learn and use the techniques used by the writer to eventually create our own independent pieces.

## Guided Reading

The first book we are reading and will study is called 'The Last Wild' and is written by Piers Torday. It is an unusual but an enthralling story - set in a world where animals have been wiped out by a deadly virus called the Red Eye and only our main character, Kester, can save the last remaining wild animals who have survived so far. The story takes us on an adventure across wild countryside to the Premium City to find Kester's scientist Dad who may have found a cure. The chapters are full of exciting twists but though it all contains some serious messages about human behaviour and the devastating impact we have on the world. The children love this book so far and have enjoyed the different plot twists.

## Maths

---

In maths we have revisited our place value learning to ensure we have the foundations in place to tackle more complex concepts through the year. This ranged from Number values, decimals, rounding and written addition/subtraction. This week we have begun our work on factors.

## Foundation Subjects

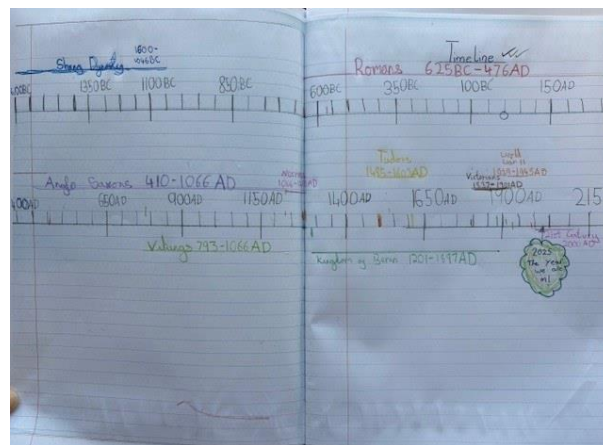
---

This term sees our year 6's delve into the history of Crime and Punishment over the last 1000 years, which is a great way to retrieve learning through KS2 in history. The children have begun by pulling together a timeline to show the different civilisations and time periods they have studied at All Saints. The children love this topic and pulls together a lot of their previous learning.

In science the children are studying Living Things and Their Habitats. In this topic they are classifying living organisms and using branching databases to help classify.

In computing the unit looks at the code-breaking at Bletchley Park, history of computers, how they have developed to designing a computer for the future. The first two lessons have been great fun as the children explored many different deciphers and codes as well as coding a brute force hack. This led to vital learning around creating safe passwords and why we should use upper, lower case, numbers and special characters.

Finally, in PE we are lucky to have a coach come in every Friday to lead cricket with the children - the aim is to build their hand-eye coordination and striking skills.

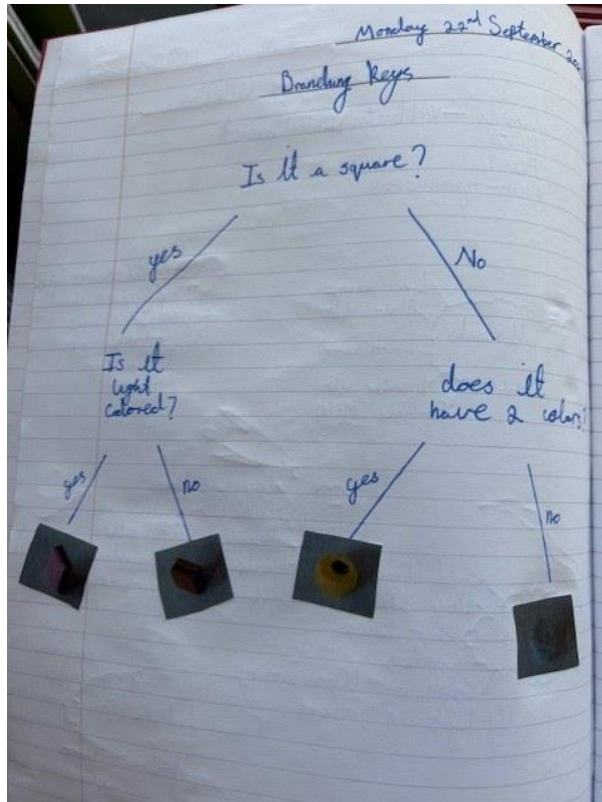
