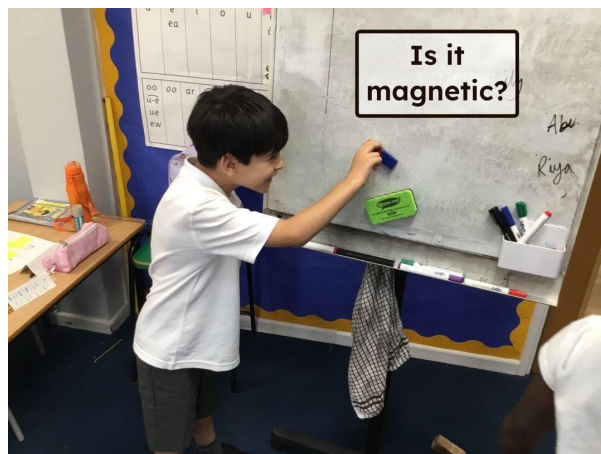


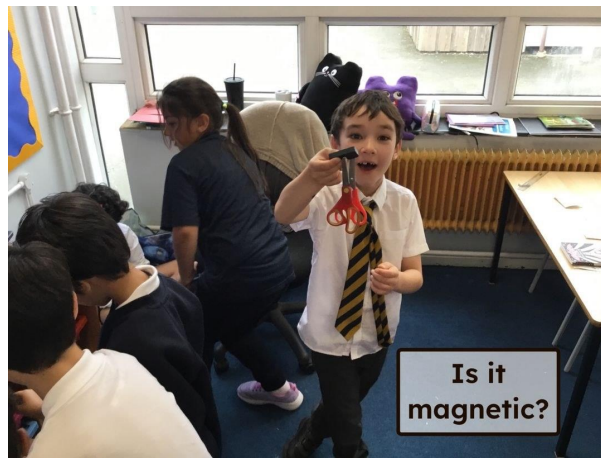
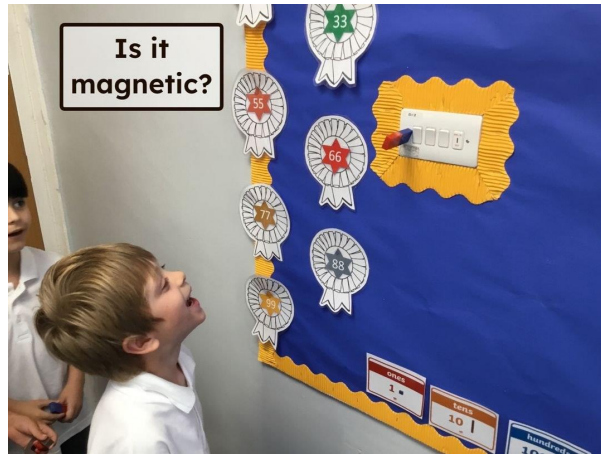

In music Lovelace have been enjoying percussion and forming bands to perform using notations. The class have created pieces of music to match a image as well as providing a soundtrack for a short animated film.





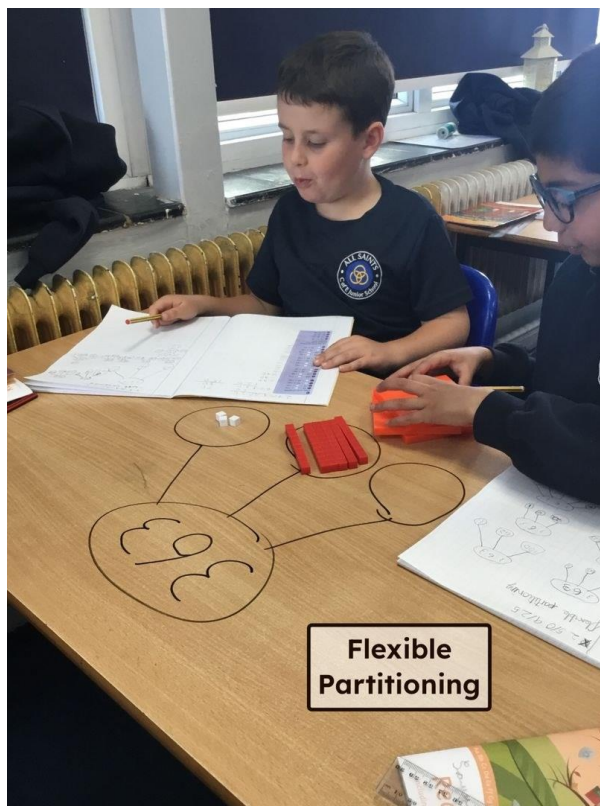

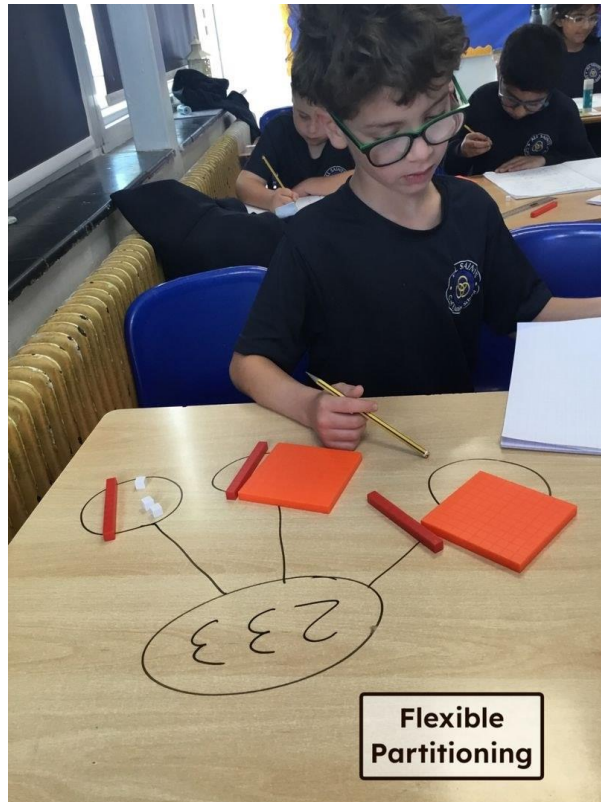

**In our ongoing quest for professional development, our staff meeting this week will be training on Five To Thrive.**

'The **five to thrive** model is a way of understanding how connected relationships are fundamental to human wellbeing and help us to build resilient communities. More than 90% of what we know about the brain has been discovered in the last 20 years or so – research in neuroscience is transforming how we think about wellbeing and resilience. One of the key findings is that people need people.'

### ***Hosted by Parenting Special Children***

Interoception helps you to understand and feel what's going on inside your body. Those who struggle with the interoceptive sense may have trouble knowing when they feel tired, hungry, full, thirsty, hot or cold. Having trouble with this sense can also make self-regulation a challenge.

Helping with self-regulation, Recognising hunger/Always hungry, Toileting, Making a connection with emotions.

- Please also DO NOT draw a border unless you want it to appear on the final product.

### **Do**

---

- Bright, colourful Christmas designs that fill the A4 paper produce the best results.
- Use paint, felt tip, crayon, inks and coloured pencils.
- Use collage.
- Use glitter glue.
- Make sure any text is bold, legible and kept AWAY from the edges of the A4 paper.

### **Don't**

---

- Please DO NOT use sprinkle glitter (glitter glue is fine) - it has a tendency to fall off and end up on other children's artwork and our scanners!
- If you are doing collage, please MAKE SURE ALL ITEMS ARE FIRMLY STUCK DOWN TO STOP THEM FALLING OFF
- Avoid metallic finishes over large areas.
- Pale coloured pencils on a white background do not reproduce well.
