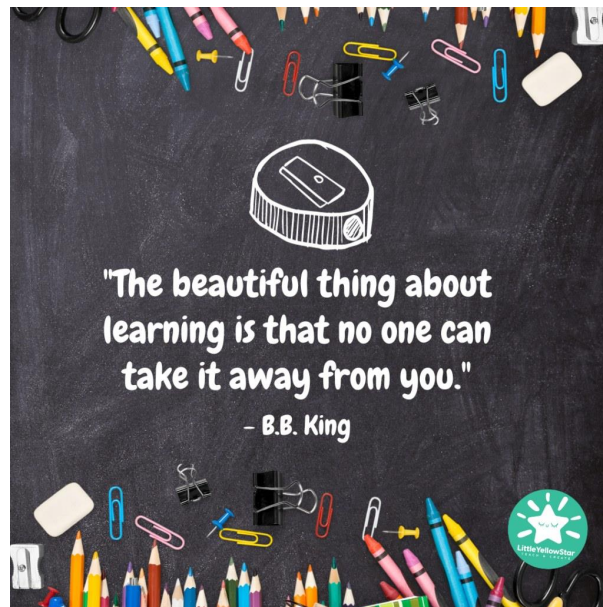

Class Spotlight - Lindgren



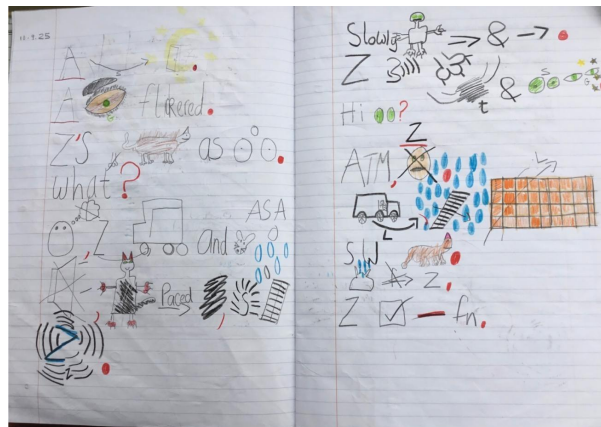
Class Lingren has settled in brilliantly, making the most of the lovely September weather with some outdoor learning sessions. It was wonderful to see the children collaborating in pairs and small groups, sharing ideas and building those all-important teamwork skills from the very start.



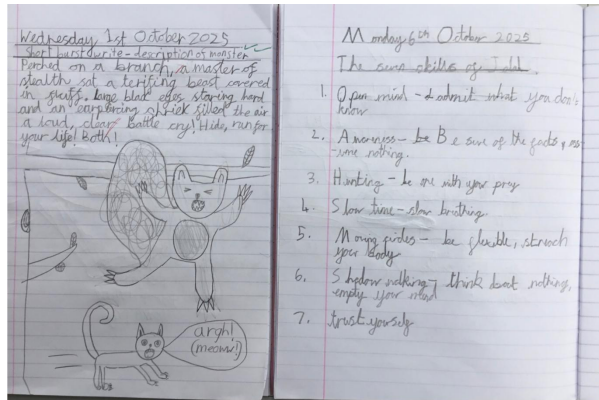


English

In English, the children have been learning how to write a tale of fear, using the suspense toolkit. As a model text, we use “Zelda Claw and the Rain Cat” first, learning to tell the story by looking at a story map. Having mastered this, children write the story. We have discussed the ways in which a tension can be created- from making the weather stormy and the setting quiet and dark, to showing- not telling- that the character is scared. Talk4Writing scheme allows children to understand the structure, which can be followed to write a good story.

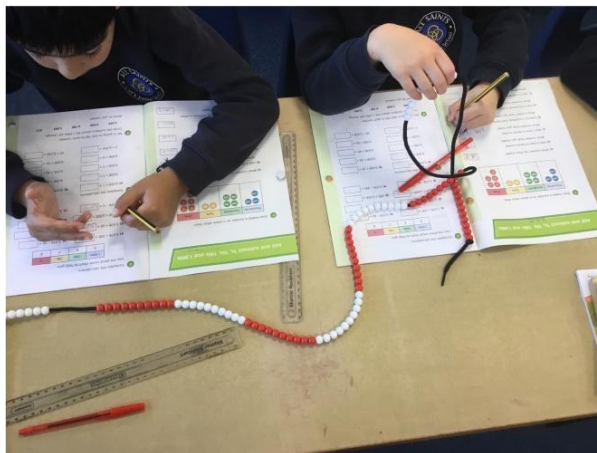


We have been utterly captivated by our first class novel, *Varjak Paw* by S.F. Said. This thrilling story follows a unique cat who must use mysterious ancient skills to survive in a dangerous city. It has sparked fantastic discussions about bravery, friendship and seeing the world from a different perspective.



Maths

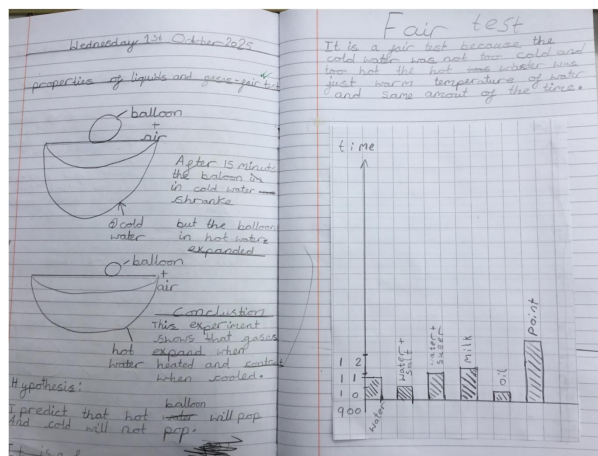
The first unit of Maths focuses on deepening the understanding of the basics. Place value may seem easy, but the problem-solving part and the explanation of the reasoning are not that simple. This was what Year 4 had been learning before we moved on to addition and subtraction.





Science

Wednesday afternoons are a highlight, as Class Lingren transforms into a laboratory of young scientists! Our current unit on 'States of Matter' has us investigating the properties of solids, liquids, and gases. The children are loving setting up fair tests, making predictions (hypotheses), and analysing their results like true professionals.



PE

There's no shortage of energy when it comes to PE! The children have been learning essential skills like footwork and ball control, which they are now applying to invasion games. We're not just playing, but also learning about game rules, tactics and the importance of teamwork, all while having lots of fun!

More than 90% of what we know about the brain has been discovered in the last 20 years or so – research in neuroscience is transforming how we think about wellbeing and resilience. One of the key findings is that people need people.'

- All shoulder length hair should be tied back at all times during the school day.
- No jewellery should be worn in PE lessons.
- Plain studded earrings should be removed on PE days or can be taped up by the child with micro fibre tape. Please include that in their PE kit if necessary.

- Please check your child's trainers are not thread bare and have sufficient grip to avoid accidents.

If you need help with PE kit please let the office know.

Your child will be given a reminder note if they are not meeting the PE Kit requirements.

Afterschool Sports Club Routine

If your child is unable to attend a club after school, please inform the school office so your child can be accounted for.

Registers are taken at the beginning of an afterschool club so anyone absent can be accounted for.

If your child misses 2 consecutive weeks without explanation, their place can be offered to someone else. (This is only applicable to free clubs).

Clubs normally finish at 4.30pm, please arrive promptly to pick your child up.
