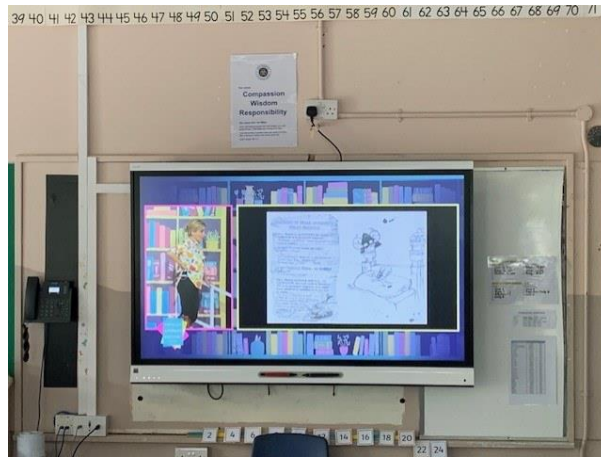

The Five to thrive model is a way of understanding how connected relationships are fundamental to human wellbeing and help us to build resilient communities. More than 90% of what we know about the brain has been discovered in the last 20 years or so – research in neuroscience is transforming how we think about wellbeing and resilience. One of the key findings is that people need people. This workshop will explore the five to thrive building blocks and describe a sequence of relational activities that build healthy brains in young children and maintain healthy brain function throughout their life.

Class Spotlight - Attenborough

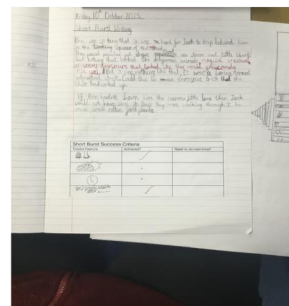
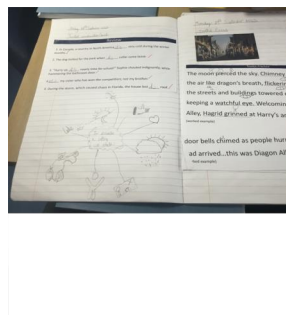
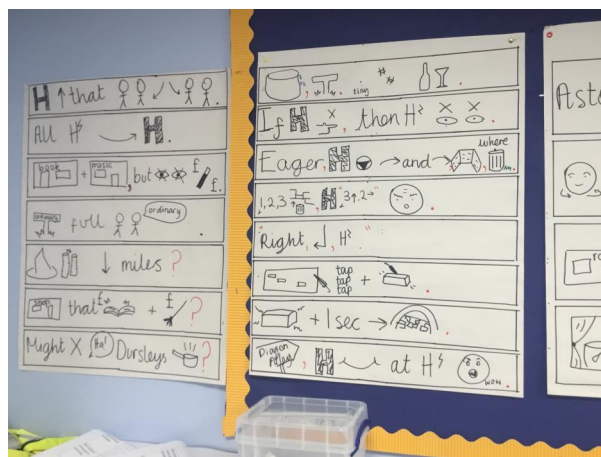
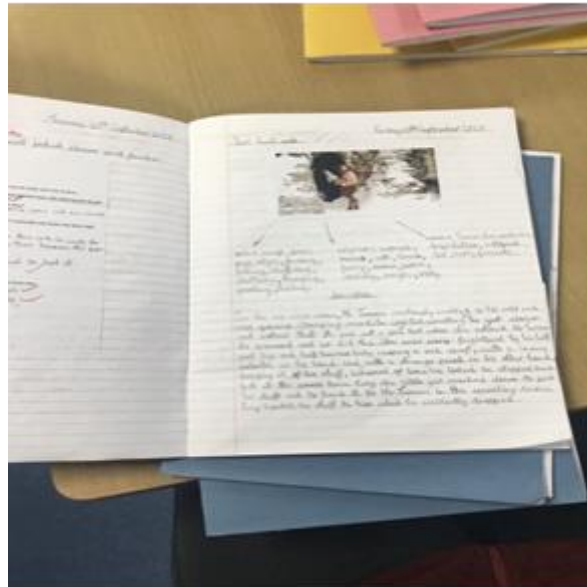


Class Attenborough have made a fantastic start to Year 5, settling in quickly and have been helpful and considerate when supporting a new teacher joining the All Saints community.

English

In English, the class has been diving into a portal story inspired by Diagon Alley as part of Talk4Writing. After learning the model text using text maps and actions as well as comparing the text to other portal stories, they've been planning their own imaginative versions—featuring ancient worlds, futuristic cities, eerie forests, and video game-inspired realms.

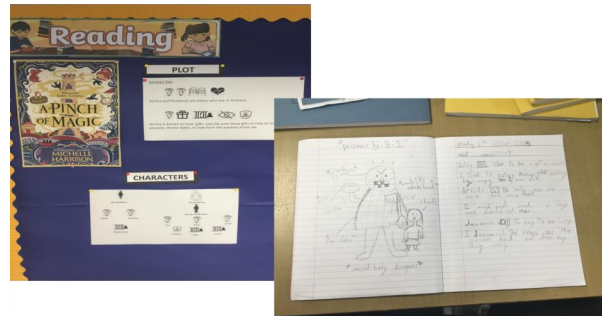
These stories have given students an opportunity to focus on vivid description tools such as similes, focus on the senses and creative choice of adjectives, to name a few.



Reading

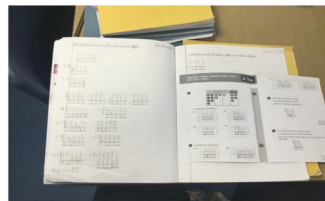
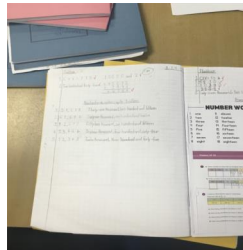
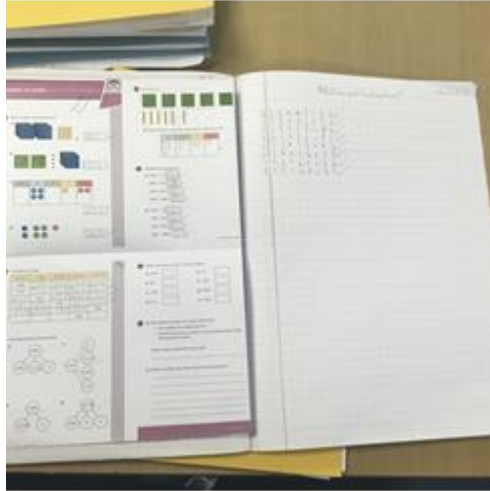
We've been gripped by *A Pinch of Magic* by Michelle Harrison—a magical tale about three sisters trapped by a family curse that stops them from leaving their island. As they try to

break the curse, they encounter danger, mystery, and the power of sisterhood. We've explored the text through drama and discussion, while also diving into related topics such as the history of Halloween, global superstitions, and real-life mysterious places like Alcatraz and the Tower of London.



Maths

We began the term by strengthening our understanding of place value before moving on to formal written methods for addition and subtraction. We've also started a new scheme—*Mastering Number at Key Stage 2*—which uses quick, interactive lesson starters to help students sharpen their understanding of multiplication and division facts and build confidence with number relationships.



Foundation Subjects

In PE, students have been playing invasion games and are looking forward to the inter-house netball competition next week. We've focused on different passes, defending and intercepting players as well as progressing and passing without moving their feet. During indoor PE, students have been using a range of equipment and apparatus to build on their gymnastics skills, including balance, travel and shape. There's also lots of excitement building for swimming lessons next term!

In Science, we've been learning about materials and their different states of matter, with hands-on experiments to explore soluble and insoluble materials and reversible and irreversible changes and getting to grips with lots of new scientific vocabulary. In History, we've been investigating the Vikings and considering their reputation as raiders, traders or something else by exploring primary and secondary sources. In Computing, the focus has been on online safety, helping students understand how to stay safe and make smart choices online. Meanwhile in RE, we've been learning about Sikhism and how Sikhs show commitment to their faith through their beliefs, actions, and community life.

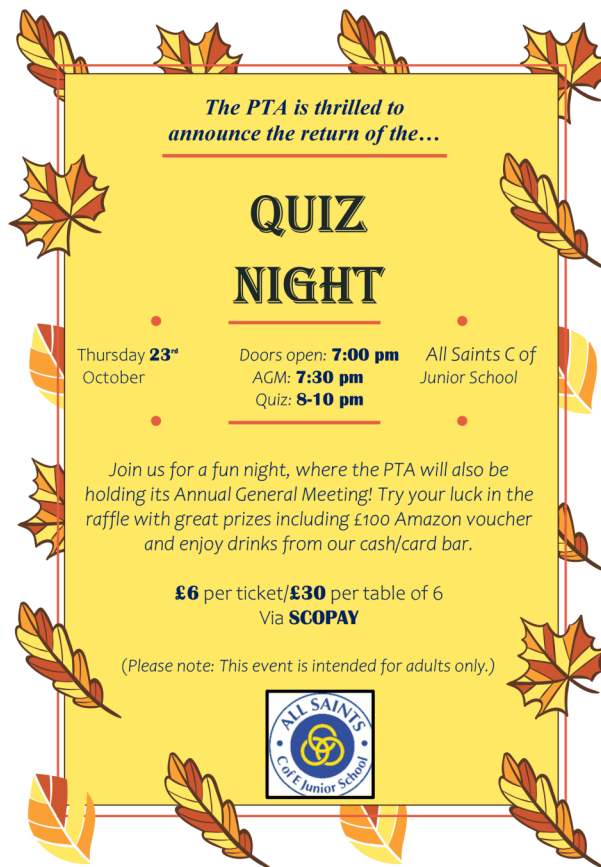

Ready for PE lessons and Sport Clubs - Safety

We've had a great start to a new year in PE, including a taster of Kick boxing but please be reminded about some essentials for safety.

- All shoulder length hair should be tied back at all times during the school day.
- No jewellery should be worn in PE lessons.
- Plain studded earrings should be removed on PE days or can be taped up by the child with micro fibre tape. Please include that in their PE kit if necessary.

- Please check your child's trainers are not thread bare and have sufficient grip to avoid accidents.

If you need help with PE kit please let the office know.

Your child will be given a reminder note if they are not meeting the PE Kit requirements.

Afterschool Sports Club Routine

If your child is unable to attend a club after school, please inform the school office so your child can be accounted for.

Registers are taken at the beginning of an afterschool club so anyone absent can be accounted for.

If your child misses 2 consecutive weeks without explanation, their place can be offered to someone else. (This is only applicable to free clubs).

Clubs normally finish at 4.30pm, please arrive promptly to pick your child up.
