The Five to thrive model is a way of understanding how connected relationships are fundamental to human wellbeing and help us to build resilient communities. More than 90% of what we know about the brain has been discovered in the last 20 years or so – research in neuroscience is transforming how we think about wellbeing and resilience. One of the key findings is that people need people. This workshop will explore the five to thrive building blocks and describe a sequence of relational activities that build healthy brains in young children and maintain healthy brain function throughout their life.

New Lunchtime Clubs

Year 3-6 Speedstacking Club – Tuesday lunchtimes – Small Hall 12:30pm

We've got a coach from Premier Education who is running a Year 3/4 Basketball/ Netball Club starting this Thursday 6th November – Thursday 11th December, a total of 6 weeks. Children can join in for a free trial this week and we are then asking for £20 to cover the cost of this extra provision.

## School Swimming

This has been received positively and it's great to see the massive improvement the children are making, Congratulations!

Aquino have finished and Attenborough have started their lessons at school but please do consider maintaining their progression as by the end of year 6 children are expected to be able to swim :



- At least 25m
- Demonstrate variety of strokes e.g. front, back and breaststroke.
- Perform self rescue skills

Year 4 are swimming in the Spring Term and Year 3 will be doing this in the Summer Term. We are also considering if we can give Year 6 some swimming lessons too.

## Events

Young Ambassadors Sport Leadership Training – Monday 6th October

These children receive sports leadership training for being a good sporting role model, organised and keen to inspire others. Primary school pupils in years 5 & 6 can become a Young Ambassador (Sports Leader). This is designed to add value to our programme at school. We select 2 children from year 5 and 6 so we have succession in place. The day involves activities and planning time with a member of staff (Mr Mckrell this time) about

future activity back at school. The Sport Ambassadors have already had a meeting with Mrs Thompson and will be starting to put their ideas into action.



### Year 3/ 4 Netball Fliers – Wednesday 15th October

This was the first event we've hosted for Ascot & Maidenhead School Sports Partnership (A&MSSP), which is the local school's PE network we have been a member of for a few years. Following the Bee Netball training we hosted last year it was agreed to hold an event for the younger children to encourage them to play netball. We also incorporate the Bee Netball activities into the inter-house netball tournament when everyone is included to participate.

A group of children went to this new School Sport Partnership event at Newlands Girls' School. The children got to try new sports; Roundnet, Pickleball, Pillo Polo + Bowls in a series of skills stations and incorporating some mini games.

The aim was to increase confidence to try new activities, boost self-esteem, motivation and resilience. Everyone has great fun and we hope to adapt some of the ideas into our provision at school.

**Tools With a Mission (TWAM)** are a Christian charity, based in the UK, that collects unwanted usable tools, refurbishes them, and sorts them into trade tool kits for livelihood creation. We have a mission to empower people and groups in need, offering them a way through tools to put poverty in the past and begin their own sustainable careers. In doing so, we also enrich our local UK communities through volunteering opportunities and waste reduction, contributing significantly to environmental sustainability.

**The Impact in Africa:** Toolkits are sent to community groups, who provide training to their members on how to effectively use them. This empowers trainees to become self-sufficient upon graduating from their course. Beneficiaries include vulnerable people who may be in abusive relationships or unable to work due to family circumstances.
