The challenge is to complete six easy activities at home with your family and friends. By getting involved, you'll be raising awareness, sparking change, and directly helping to reduce our carbon footprint. At the end of the month, we'll report back on how many of our school community joined in and add up the amazing amount of carbon we saved together!

Stick this checklist on your fridge and start cutting carbon today!

Here are your six challenges for the month:

- 1. Go Plant-Based for Three Meals** Meat production is responsible for around 14% of the world's greenhouse gas emissions. Discover how delicious cutting carbon can be by making three evening meals plant-based this month!
- 2. Make Three Journeys 'Active'** Transport creates nearly a quarter of the UK's carbon emissions. Choose active travel like walking, scooting, wheeling, or cycling for three journeys. It's emission-free and great for you!
- 3. Have a Device-Free Day** Electricity makes up about 25% of your home's carbon footprint. Power down non-essential devices for one full day. No gaming, no streaming. Rediscover the joy of offline fun!
- 4. Meal Plan for One Week** The average person wastes 95kg of food per year! Planning meals and shopping smart reduces waste and the carbon produced from food rotting in landfill. It's good for the planet and your wallet!
- 5. Lower Your Washing Temperature** Washing machines are energy-hungry! Cut carbon without sacrificing clean clothes by lowering the temperature to 30°C for three washes this month. Cool it to care!
- 6. Turn Down the Heating by 1°C** Heating is the top source of home carbon emissions in the UK. Turn it down by just 1°C for one week, layer up, and show your love for the planet, one cosy jumper at a time!

Class Spotlight - Shelley



After a great start to the year, the children have settled well into their new school day routines. The half-term break seemed so short, and the second half term is already in full swing.

English

In English, the children are embarking on a persuasive text this term, with Hawk Ridge Farm Park as our model text. We will explore many similar texts to build a toolkit of techniques required to build an effective, persuasive text and the children will soon start using inverted commas to punctuate speech.

We are continuing to read *Charlotte's web*, as the children eagerly awaits the outcome of the little pig, Wilbur's, fate. The children have enjoyed listening to the story, getting to know the different characters and seeing the plot unfold. Children are also given the chance to read out loud to the class, taking note of the punctuation and starting to read with expression. We do many fluency reading exercises as a class and are emphasising the interpretation of different forms of punctuation.



Maths

In Maths we continue with the foundation of addition and subtraction and are learning mental and written methods to add and subtract larger numbers. Our work on Place Value in the first term has cemented our understanding of the value of hundreds, tens and ones.





Science

In Science this term we will be looking at animals (including humans, of course) and our first lesson was a recap of animal diets as omnivores, herbivores or carnivores. The children read about the diets of meerkats, lions and elephants and took a shot at designing a meal menu for them. We were very impressed with our budding chefs and their inspired menus.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. We started by exploring the timeline of different ages and civilizations, and the children were particularly surprised by how long the Palaeolithic Period lasted. It has been fascinating to see how the basic living and houses changed during the Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic periods as humans evolved. We are continuing to explore archaeological findings about the Bronze Age and Iron Age, and we know that our next topic of volcanoes will be equally well received.

In RE, the children showed curiosity and great maturity in learning about how Hindus (Sanatani Dharma) live a good life. The children were inspired by their service of others and in particular SEWA, they're community outreach. This encouraged the children to think about how they might serve others and look after our environment. This term we will be learning about Christianity and exploring the question: 'Have Christmas lost its true meaning?'

In Art this term the children are sketching, recognising shapes, holding their pencils in different ways to create different lines and shading to improve their drawings.

In PSHE this term, we are celebrating differences and in our first lessons we were thinking about our families and how they might look different, but still love and care for us. The children celebrated their families with a family portrait.



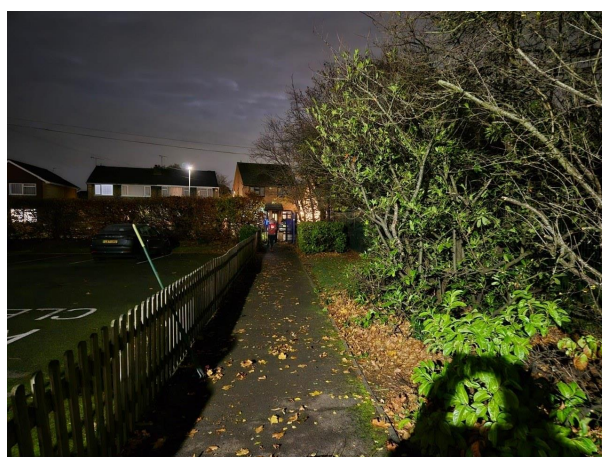
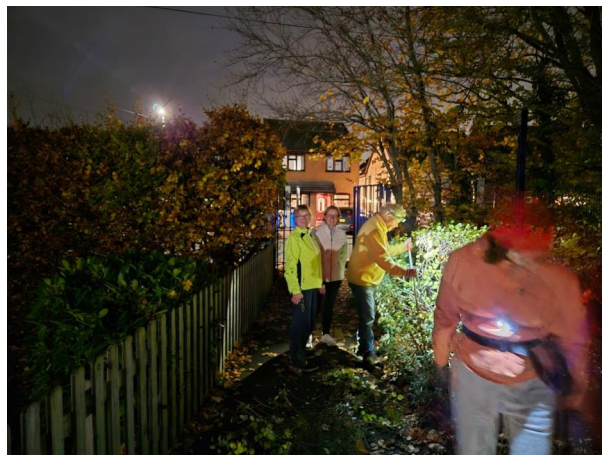
We also took part in a live anti-bullying lesson hosted by the BBC and completed different challenges, learning to be brave and stand up for others.

The Five to thrive model is a way of understanding how connected relationships are fundamental to human wellbeing and help us to build resilient communities. More than 90% of what we know about the brain has been discovered in the last 20 years or so – research in neuroscience is transforming how we think about wellbeing and resilience. One of the key findings is that people need people. This workshop will explore the five to thrive building blocks and describe a sequence of relational activities that build healthy brains in young children and maintain healthy brain function throughout their life.

Tools With a Mission (TWAM) are a Christian charity, based in the UK, that collects unwanted usable tools, refurbishes them, and sorts them into trade tool kits for livelihood creation. We have a mission to empower people and groups in need, offering them a way

through tools to put poverty in the past and begin their own sustainable careers. In doing so, we also enrich our local UK communities through volunteering opportunities and waste reduction, contributing significantly to environmental sustainability.

The Impact in Africa: Toolkits are sent to community groups, who provide training to their members on how to effectively use them. This empowers trainees to become self-sufficient upon graduating from their course. Beneficiaries include vulnerable people who may be in abusive relationships or unable to work due to family circumstances. These community groups provide them with a safe space to connect with others, learn new skills, and ultimately transform their lives. By equipping individuals with the tools they need to succeed, we help break the cycle of poverty and empower communities to thrive.

Every year, they send nearly 200 tonnes of tools to Africa and recycle any broken tools that they receive.

The Environmental Impact: TWAM promote reuse as a way to combat climate change. Every year, they send nearly 200 tonnes of tools to Africa and recycle any broken tools that they receive. Their work not only keeps tools out of landfills but also puts them in the hands of the people who need them most, reducing the overall carbon footprint. By promoting their reuse, they save over 1,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions annually.

The UK Impact: TWAM have hundreds of volunteers across the UK who collect tools, drive the van, refurbish tools, and help out in the office. Volunteering with TWAM not only offers a sense of purpose but also provides a supportive community where volunteers feel valued and cared for.
