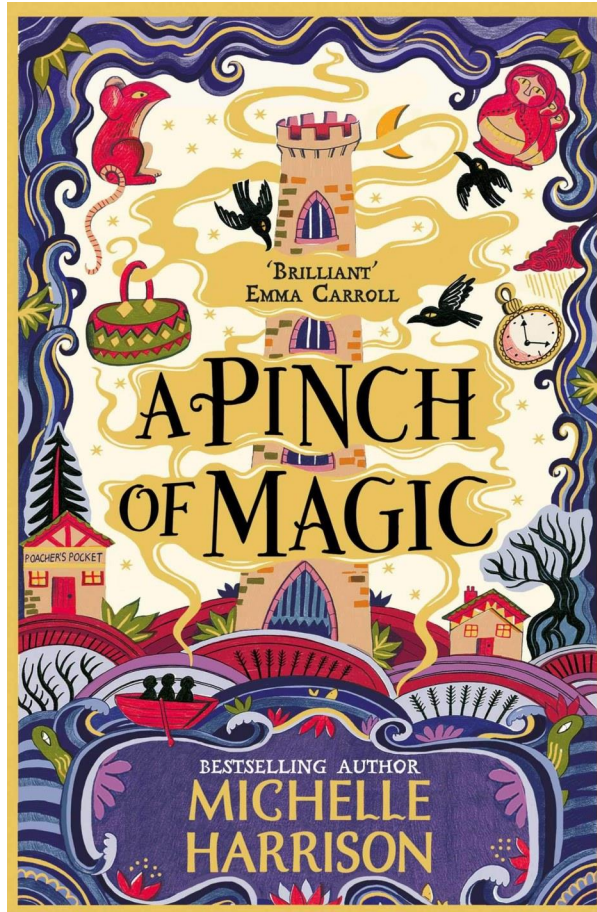

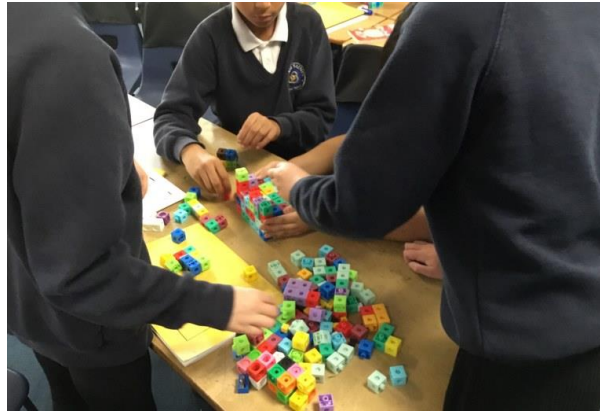

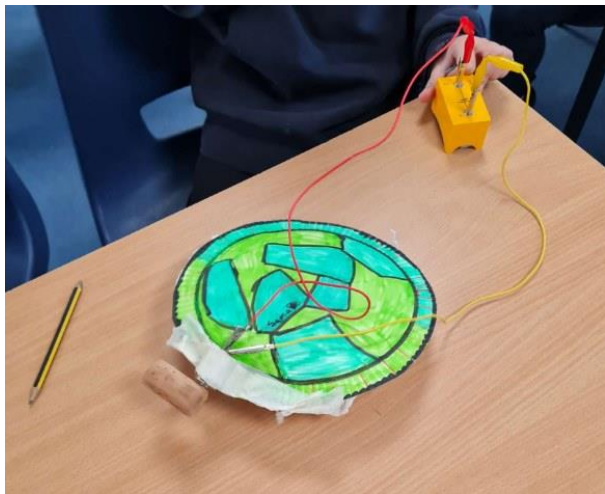


Design Technology and Art

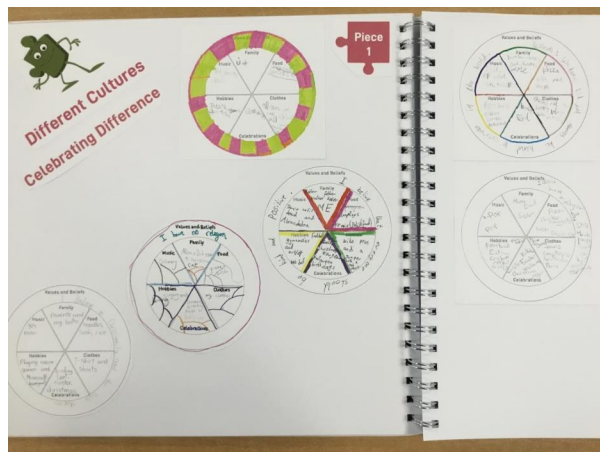




PSHE

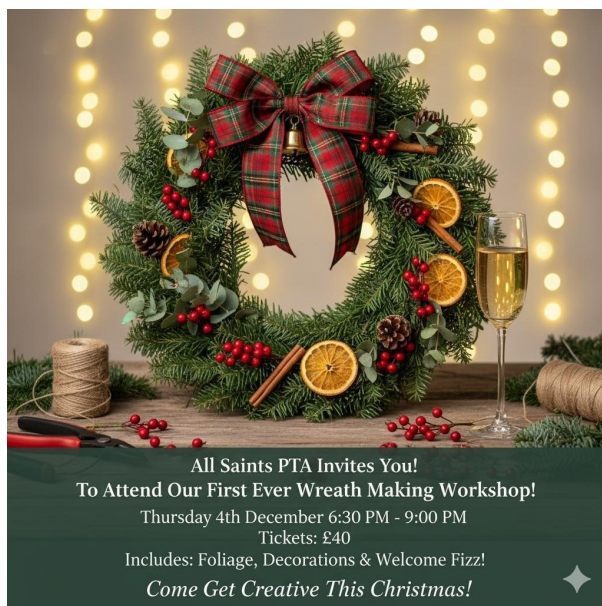

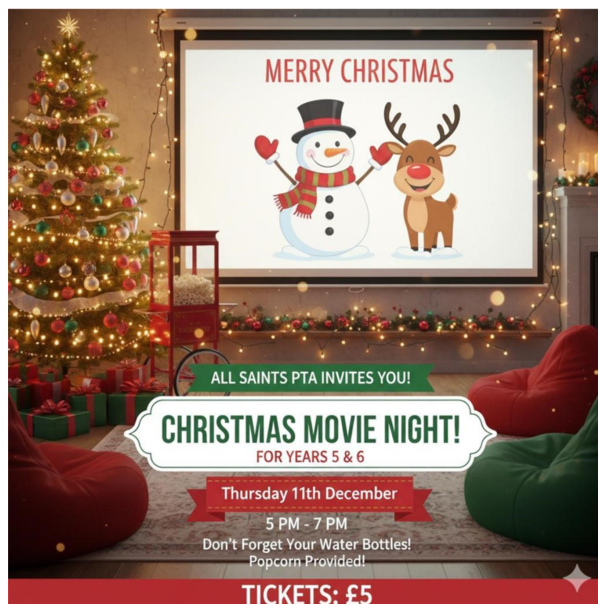
