

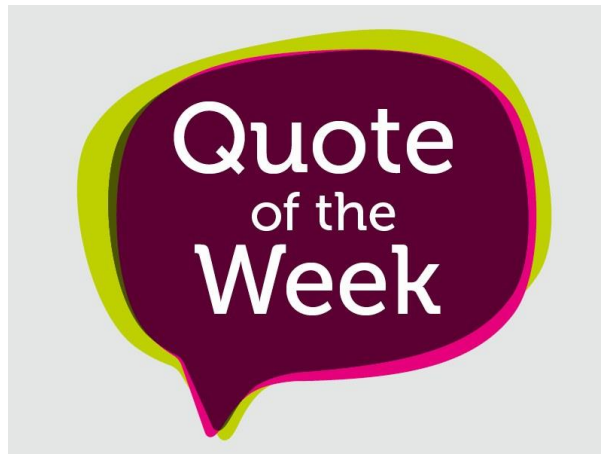

### Reading Update:

- It's that time of year again when World Book Day is nearly here! World Book Day takes place on **Thursday 5th March** and we hope you'll join us as we come together to celebrate our World Book Day in school by dressing up as your favourite character.
- This year, we have decided to hold a '**create a board game competition!** Further details have been attached.

Your board game must be brought into school by **TUESDAY 24TH February** and **clearly labelled with your NAME and CLASS.**

There will be an overall winner from each year group and the prizes will be a £5 voucher to spend at the Scholastic Book Fair, to purchase a book of their choice!! The Book Fair will be at school from 25th February – 27th February 2026.

- **All Saint's Book Swap** – This is a perfect opportunity for children to trade in books they have already read for another book that will interest them. - Once again, we have the Scholastic Book Fair visiting our school. **The book fair will be located in the corridor outside the Year 6 classrooms and will be open from 3.30 to 4pm on Wednesday 25th, Thursday 26th and Friday 27th February.** This is a great opportunity for you to purchase some new books and the school also receives points which can be used to buy books for the school library. The children will visit the Book Fair, during the school day and will come home with a Wishlist. They will note down the book(s) they wish to purchase, with the price. These can be paid for using the QR code at the bottom of the Wishlist. **Please note: once payments have been made, send your completed wish list into school by Thursday 26th so that I can send the purchased books home with your child.** You will have to make payments, while you are at the Fair, using a QR code, which you will be able to scan using your phones and then make the payment by card. This will take you through to a payment website. We are also able to take card payments now, using PayPal POS. **We are a cashless book fair so please remember your phones/card.**

These courses are returning to school in the Summer 1st – 3rd July, the exact dates will be confirmed subject to numbers attending.

This is an opportunity not to be missed!

1st & 2nd July, Level 1 for riders in year 4 who didn't do it in the Autumn.

1st & 2nd July, Level 2 for riders in year 5/6 who didn't do it in the Autumn.

3rd July, Level 3 for riders in year 6 only who completed level 2 in year 5 or in the Autumn.

Parents pay £5 whilst RWBW fund the remaining cost.

### *Zones of Regulation*

---

Dear Parents and Carers

**A date for your diary, Thursday 5th March at 14.30**

All staff recently undertook training on the **Zones of Regulation**, delivered by an educational psychologist.

The Zones of Regulation provide a common language for people to express and understand their emotions, as well as tools and strategies to help them move between zones. The goal is to help individuals recognise and regulate their emotions, leading to improved self-control, social interactions, and overall well-being.

We are planning to pilot this approach in Year 4 before rolling it out across the whole school. We have started to do so already and have seen some positive outcomes. We feel that this is an approach that could also be used at home to help the children improve self-control and

their overall well-being. If used both at school and at home we believe that the consistency of approach will be very beneficial.

To support this approach we have booked a time and date for the educational psychologist to deliver a session to parents and carers. This session will cover an overview, its goals and how to implement it.

To help us with planning, could you let the office know if you are going to attend.
