World Book Day

Last week we celebrated World Book Day with many activities through the week alongside dressing up on Thursday and the visit of Catherine Barr on Friday. Catherine Barr visited the school to tell us about her books which are based on true events involving wildflie. It was a great topic with many of our children fascinated by her books. We really enjoyed the visit and learnt a great deal.



The Big Plastic Count

This week our school is taking part in **The Big Plastic Count**, the UK's largest investigation into household plastic waste. From **9–15 March**, pupils across the country are counting the plastic packaging their households throw away to understand how much plastic we use and what happens to it.

If your child has brought home a **Count Sheet**, please support them by recording plastic packaging such as bottles, wrappers, yoghurt pots and food containers before they are thrown away. The information collected will be combined with results from thousands of

families and schools across the UK to show the true scale of plastic waste and encourage action to reduce it.

Thank you for helping your child take part in this important environmental investigation.

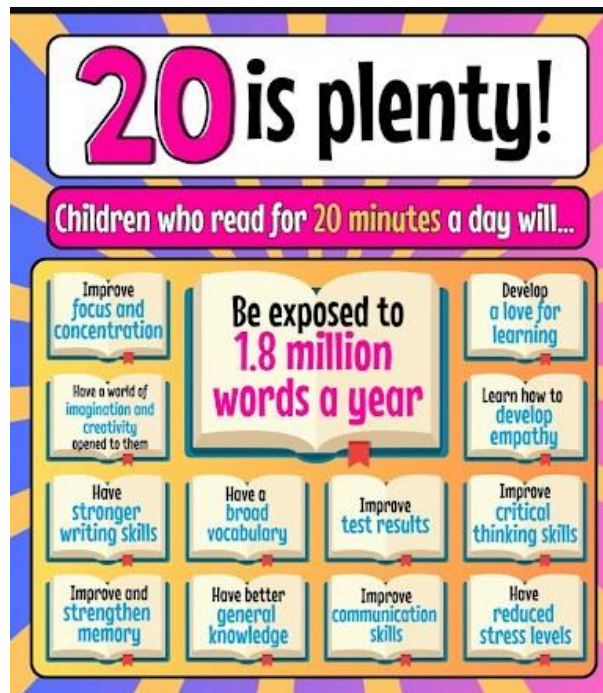

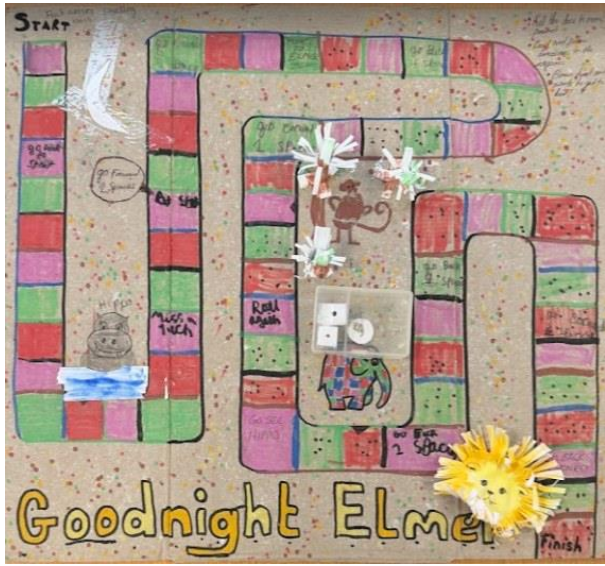

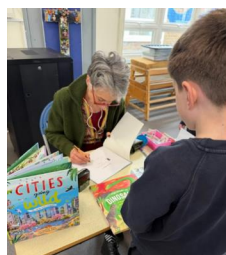


Well done and thank you to everyone who took part!

- First of all, we were incredibly lucky to have TWO author visits, courtesy of Maidenhead's Big Read. On Friday 6th March, the whole school had the opportunity to meet the author **Catherine Barr**, who has written books such as, **Cities Going Wild, The Colours of Nature, Wildlife Crossings** and many more! Catherine held a fantastic, engaging assembly for the whole school, talking about real matters and issues in the environment and what we can do to help. It was refreshing to meet a Non-fiction author, who writes passionately about current topics. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about the animals she has written about and even had a chance to draw a hedgehog!

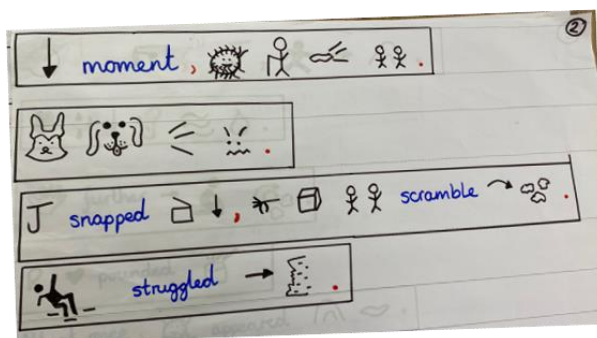

Spotlight - Owens

Wow! Can you believe we are halfway through this academic year already? It is great to see the children flourishing as we learn lots of new things across the curriculum. They are growing in confidence and building resilience to work towards our positive growth mindset mantra "We can do hard things."

In our **Talk for Writing**, we are well on our way to learning our new text map for 'Adventure at Sandy Cove.' An exciting suspenseful adventure about two boys who stumble upon some stolen jewels while out at the beach searching for shells.

Ask your child to tell you the story using the visual pictures to help remind them of the story.





In **Maths** this term we have been working on fractions. The children have been applying their multiplication and division knowledge to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa. Seeing how important it is to have a solid understanding of their tables has

spurred on their learning of their tables, well done for all your efforts in class and on TT Rockstars to be terrific at **all** times table facts.

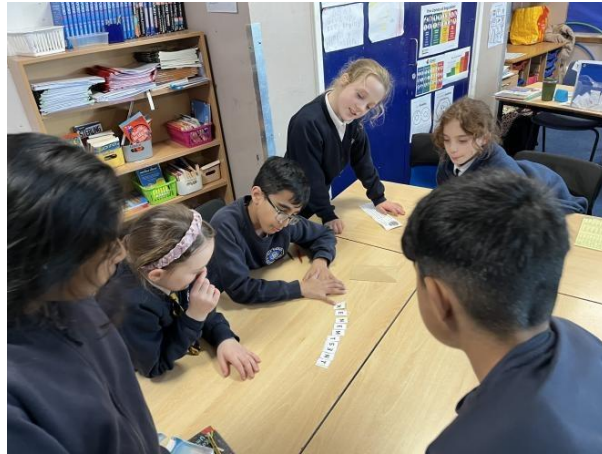
In **Science** we have been learning all about Animals and their Habitats. From grouping vertebrates and invertebrates, classification keys and food chains, it's been an interesting topic. The children enjoyed searching our school grounds for invertebrates finding lots of worms, snails and slugs plus some rather shy woodlouse and a few little (thankfully for Mrs Tucker) arachnids.

This half term is a **Geography** topic.' Where does our food come from?' We had a great first lesson using all the food packaging the children brought in to find the origins of the food on a world map. It was also evident how much plastic our food comes in, something the children are focusing on this week at home with **The Big Plastic Count** as part of our **Sustainability Curriculum**. We will also be looking at food miles and the benefits of eating seasonally and exploring Fair Trade. If you could have a look in your fridge and cupboards for any Fair-Trade items and discuss these with your child, that would be great.

In ICT lessons this term we are learning that HTML is a text base coding language, which defines how a website is displayed. This week the children needed to identify the different HTML codes and remix them to change the text on a 'Wanted Poster'.



In RE we are asking the question 'Is forgiveness always possible for Christians?' Last week we considered what the words 'forgiveness' and 'resentment' mean and discussed why it may be difficult to forgive in certain situations. The children acted in five different scenarios and then discussed and reflected that sometimes it is easier to forgive than others, and how different situations can make us feel. We asked the questions; What shows forgiveness? Why did you choose to forgive or not forgive? Are there times when it is easier than others? Is there a limit to how many times you can or should forgive somebody for something?



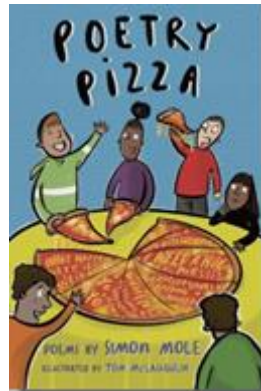
In PSHE this term we have introduced the topic 'Healthy Me'. We have looked at the friendship groups the children are part of, how they are formed and how they fit into them. The children have reflected on their friendships, how different people make them feel, and which friends they value the most. The class will also look at how smoking, vaping and alcohol effects health and then look at the reasons why people might drink or smoke. Finally, we will discuss peer pressure and how to deal with it.

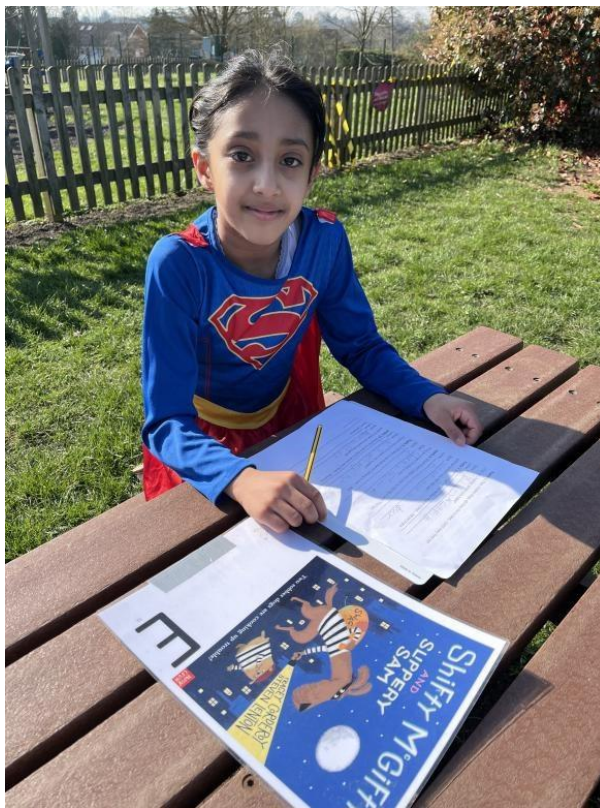
In PE the children are developing and applying their sending and receiving and counterbalance with a partner through focused skill development sessions, healthy competition and cooperative games. In dance, the children have been working brilliantly in pairs to create pathways both on the ground and in the air, using the journey of a river from source to sea as inspiration. We are very fortunate to have the expert dance skills of dance coach Jane Douglass to lead year 4 this term. Her enthusiasm, skill and creativity have been inspiring the children to thrive in the lessons. It is great to be involved and to see new skills and confidence bloom. After a wonderful term of swimming last term, this is another exciting opportunity to enrich and encourage different forms of exercise.

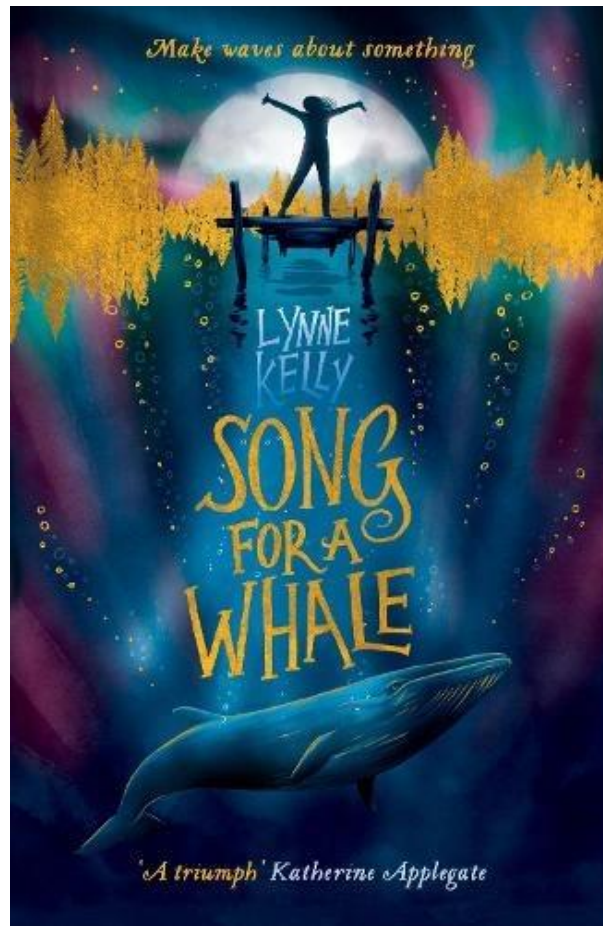

School Swimming Lessons

- At least 25m
- Demonstrate a variety of strokes e.g. front, back and breaststroke.
- Perform self-rescue skills

Year 3 are swimming in the Summer Term, and we are currently trying to get some pool time for Year 6 to have extra swimming lessons too.

If your child has not yet visited a swimming pool please consider taking them, they'll love it and it's a great family activity to share!

Learn a skill for life and enjoy the health benefits of swimming.

Bikeability

These courses are returning to school in the Summer 1st – 3rd July, the exact dates will be confirmed subject to numbers attending.

This is an opportunity not to be missed!

1st & 2nd July, Level 1 for riders in year 4 who didn't do it in the Autumn.

1st & 2nd July, Level 2 for riders in year 5/6 who didn't do it in the Autumn.

3rd July, Level 3 for riders in year 6 only who completed level 2 in year 5 or in the Autumn.
