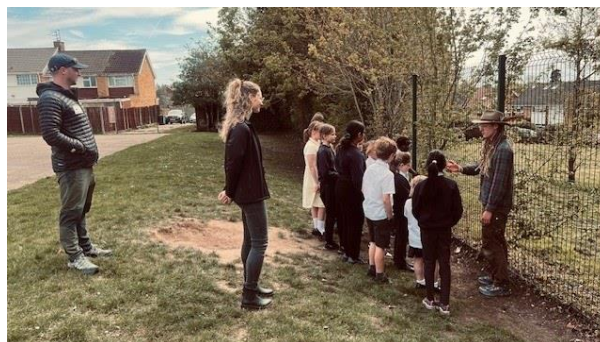
ECO News



On the 14th April, we had a visit from the rangers at Braywick Nature Centre and it was a really valuable experience for us as Eco Leaders.

We started by meeting the rangers and talking to them about what we already do in school to support the environment. They asked us lots of questions, and we were proud to share our ideas and knowledge. It felt good to see that they were impressed with how much we already knew and how confidently we could explain it.

After that, we walked around the school grounds together. We looked closely at different areas and discussed how we could improve biodiversity. The rangers gave us practical advice and helped us understand how even small changes can support wildlife.



They suggested improving our wildflower meadow to attract more pollinators and recommended planting a hedgerow to provide food and shelter for animals. We really liked this idea, and they offered to help us plan and plant it next winter.

We enjoyed sharing our ideas and hearing their feedback. It was inspiring to work with experts and think about how we can make our school grounds even better for nature.

Thank you to those who have already booked on, spaces are going fast!

These courses are returning to school in the Summer 1st – 3rd July, the exact dates will be confirmed subject to numbers attending.

This is an opportunity not to be missed!

1st & 2nd July, Level 1 for riders in year 4 who didn't do it in the Autumn.

1st & 2nd July, Level 2 for riders in year 5/6 who didn't do it in the Autumn.

3rd July, Level 3 for riders in year 6 only who completed level 2 in year 5 or in the Autumn.

Parents pay £5 whilst RWBW fund the remaining cost.



You will need in a serviced bicycle and if you are happy to share your bike with a friend it would help others complete the course. Please let the school office know.

Children will need their own helmet but if you need help with this, please contact the school.

2. **You will then be added to the £5 payment on Tucasi** once spaces on the courses are confirmed.
 - Spaces are offered on a first come first served as places are limited.
 - Course will only run subject to demand and need a minimum of 12 children to take part.

- **Your child will need use of a bicycle, their own helmet and must already be able to cycle as these are NOT learn to ride courses.**
