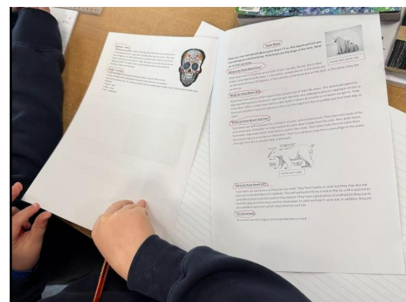
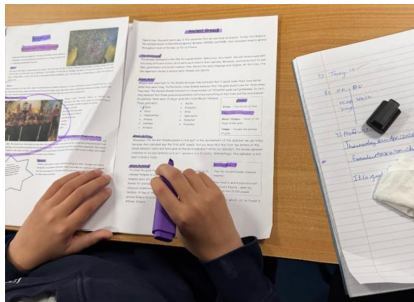
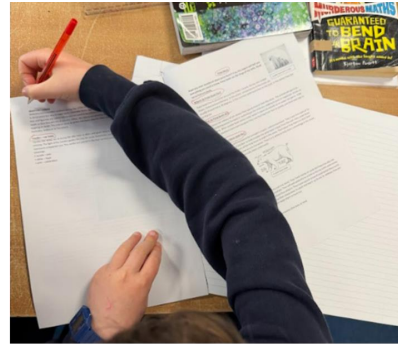
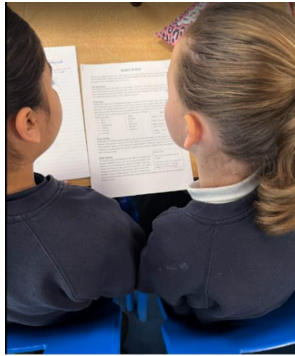
Spotlight - Hawking

We've had a great start to the new term in Hawking. The children have settled in fantastically and have thrown themselves into the new topics for the term! We have been busy revising for SATS, which the children have thrown themselves into, enthusiastically!

English

In English this term, we have been looking at Non-Fiction writing in the form of Non-Chronological reports. The focus of the reports will be on animals from the Galapagos Islands, linking to our story in Reading – Darwin's Dragons. We began the topic looking

through examples of Non-Chronological Reports, searching for the common features that appeared across each one.



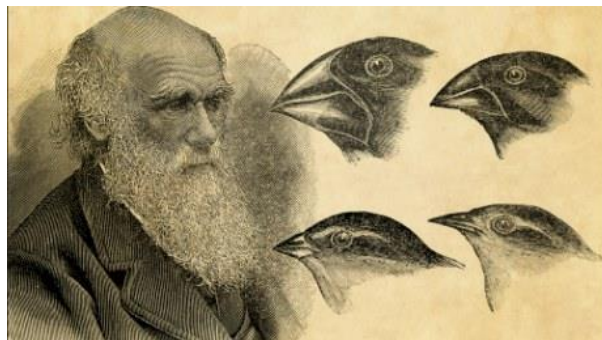
Here are a few of the animals that we will be focusing on:





Reading

Our book since last term has been 'Darwin's Dragons' by Lindsay Galvin (who came in to our school last year, for World Book Day). The story follows the journey of 'The Beagle' and one of the cabin boys, who works for Charles Darwin. Syms Covington becomes stranded on one of the Galapagos Islands and makes an astonishing discovery! The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the enchanted Galapagos Islands and the fascinating animals that inhabit them.



PE

This term, we are practicing for Sports Day by training in many different Athletics activities, such as running, throwing and jumping.

History

We are looking at which historical figure should go on the new £10 bank note. The children will evaluate different historical figures and decide the criteria for significance. Here are the historical figures the children will investigate:





Science

In Science this term, we are looking at the circulatory system and the different organs involved. The children had a fantastic hands on lesson this week, creating blood! Medication Reminder



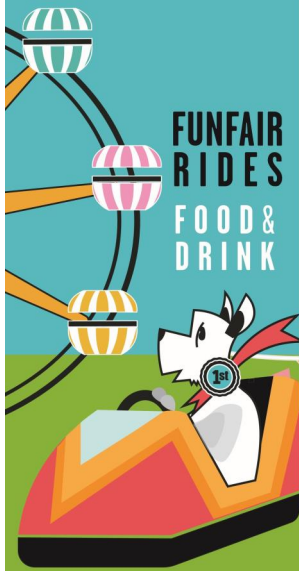
