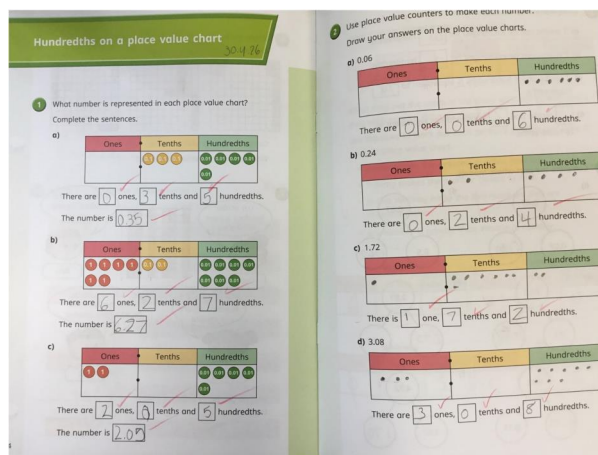
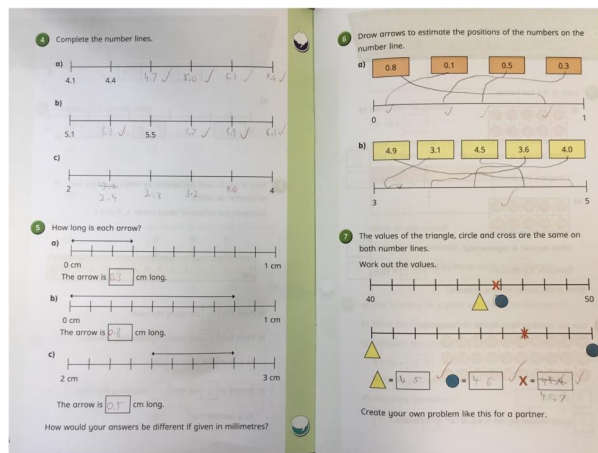

Spotlight - Lindgren

English

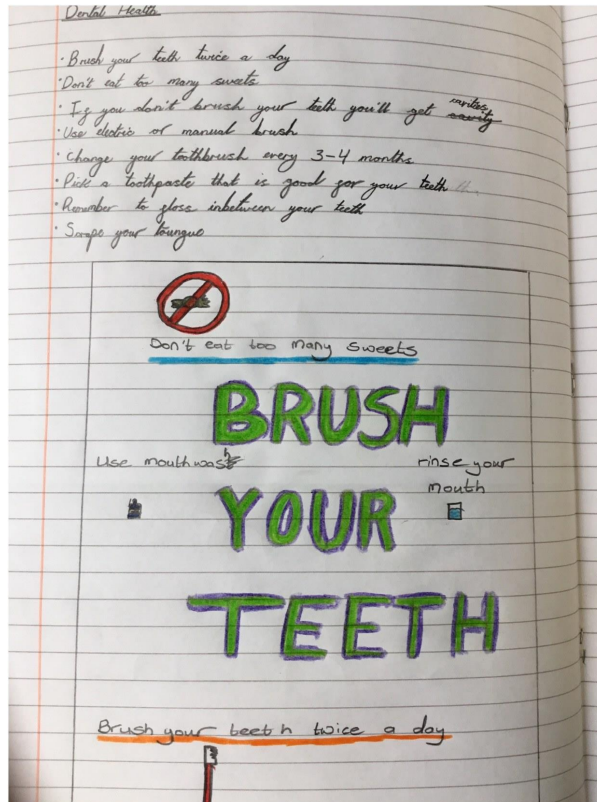
Class Lindgren have been diving into adventure writing in English, following the Talk for Writing approach based on *Adventure at a Sandy Cove*. They have explored a range of suspense techniques, including dramatic adverbials, “make it dark” descriptions, showing rather than telling, and giving the reader just a glimpse of danger. After building their skills in the Innovation phase, they are now confidently creating their own original adventure stories in their Independent Application.

In Maths, the focus has been on understanding the relationship between fractions and decimals, with particular attention to tenths and hundredths. The children are beginning to spot patterns and make useful links between the two.



Science

In Science, the children have been learning about teeth, dental hygiene, and the digestive system. They explored the different types of teeth and their functions, as well as the importance of keeping them healthy. The class also began to understand how food travels through the digestive system, linking this knowledge to how our bodies stay nourished and healthy.



Music

Music lessons have taken an exciting turn, with the children starting to learn the trombone. Thanks to a visiting teacher from Berkshire Music Trust, they are already reading simple notes and playing their first tunes, with great enthusiasm.



History

In History, the class have been exploring Anglo-Saxon daily life, with a special focus on Sutton Hoo. Many were surprised to discover just how skilled and sophisticated Anglo-Saxon craftsmanship was, challenging their initial expectations.
