This term in Class Hadid the children have been working incredibly hard. There has been the inevitable build up towards SATs with the children using maths lessons to revisit all the key

concepts we have learnt through their time at All Saints. Everyone showed great focus and drive to prepare for the assessments and we couldn't be more proud of them!

At the end of a stressful week we felt it was necessary to celebrate with our annual All Saints Bake Off competition! The children worked in groups and were given a basic cookie recipe, from that recipe the children had to adapt it with different flavours and create a theme for the presentation. Each group spent time planning (some even preparing at home!) and each pupil had their specific roles within the group. As you can see from the pictures, we were extremely impressed with the standard this year and the children loved the challenge!









A big thank you to Mrs Malhotra, Mrs Ahmed and Miss Arif who organised and supported the children with some very messy tasks!!

In writing the children have continued to work on their independent work producing non-chronological reports on animals in the Galapagos Islands, balanced arguments and a narrative full of action which used the Rock, Paper Scissors animation as a stimulus.

In science the children have been learning about the circulatory system and had an expert guest speaker Dr Egan come in to speak to the children about the workings of the circulatory system, her experience as an emergency physician and answered many inquisitive questions!

This term the children will be coming together with class Hawking to begin work on our school production - we are currently holding auditions for different roles and the children are very excited about this! This year our play is called 'Hoodwinked' and based on the familiar story of Robin Hood!! This will take place for parents on 14th and 15th July.
