We are pleased to inform you that our school is launching MyChildAtSchool (*MCAS*), an online portal designed to give you secure, real-time access to important information about your child's school life.

Through *MCAS*, you will be able to view:

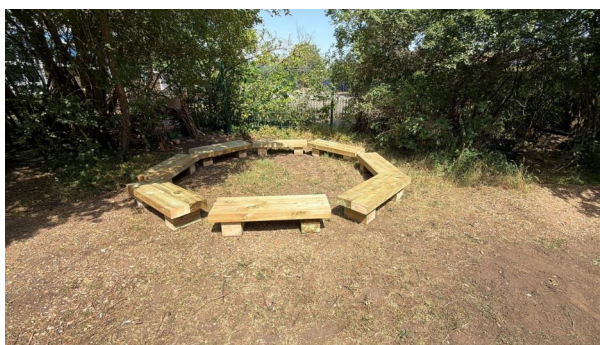
- Attendance and punctuality

Over the next few weeks, you will receive an email from *MCAS* asking you to reset your password. Please follow the link in that email to set up your account. **Do not attempt to self-register or log in before receiving this email**, as your account will not be active until the password reset process is completed. Once your password has been set, you will be able to access *MCAS* through the website or by downloading the MyChildAtSchool app, available free on both Apple and Android devices.

We believe *MCAS* will strengthen communication between home and school by making key information easier to access and helping you stay connected with your child's progress.

If you have any questions or need support with setting up your account, please contact the school office and a member of our team will be happy to assist.

Whilst everyone was enjoying a relaxing Half Term break, our very own Mr Parkin undertook the mammoth task of completing the Cuillon Ridge Traverse on the Isle of Skye in order to raise money for Inclusion at All Saints, and we are pleased to announce that he has successfully completed it and raised an incredible £660! Here is a recap of his adventures:

Well the adventure began on the Monday when we went to a climbing wall for practice and an assessment. The outcome of this was the confirmation that we were all indeed novices!

On Tuesday we leapt out of bed at 3.00 to prepare for the real thing and started our long walk to the ridge at 5.00. My only remaining hope now was that the weather forecast was wrong and that there would be inclement weather – my prayers were not answered and the sun shone for the next 2 days. We split into 2 groups and my guide for the next 2 days was going to be Sasha. When she said she was from Yorkshire, I knew that I was going to be ok. Using ropes, helmets, harnesses and her skill, I felt strangely confident and safe. The next day and a half was packed with moments and experiences that I have never had before and took me way outside my Zone of Proximal Development (teaching terminology for comfort zone).

Ultimately, whilst at times daunted by the challenge, I had an experience of a lifetime with views to match. The only thing not up to scratch was the overnight accommodation!

Spotlight - Shelley

How quickly the first half of the summer term has flown by. Before we knew it, we were enjoying a gloriously sunny—and exceptionally warm—half term break. Here is a brief update from Shelley Class, highlighting some of our learning and activities from the first half of the summer term, along with a glimpse of what lies ahead.

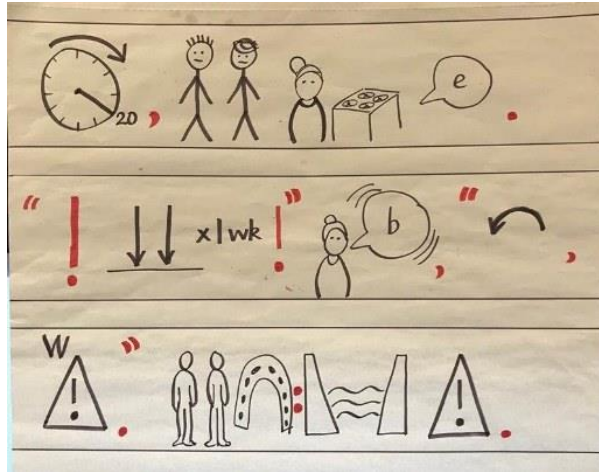
English

Our writing focus for the summer term is on creating a warning story and using dialogue to advance the action, develop character, and build tension. Our model text, *The Old Canal*, has presented new challenges for the children: it is a much longer piece of writing and includes

unfamiliar punctuation, while also addressing important themes such as water safety and the influence of peer pressure. The children have been practising the use of speech marks in their daily dictation sentences, and many are beginning to grasp the concept well. This will remain a key focus to help them apply the correct punctuation with increasing consistency. Soon, the children will use our writing toolkit to innovate using the model text and then independently write their own warning tale.

Maths

Our focus last term was primarily on length and perimeter and, of course, everyone's favourite (or perhaps not...) topic: fractions! The use of fraction wheels provided a helpful visual representation of concepts that can often feel daunting and abstract, and it was wonderful to see the children's confidence and enjoyment grow as they tackled these challenges. Maths lessons are always busy and enthusiastic, with everyone ready to have a go.

The children also continue to make steady progress—and in many cases excel—in their times tables knowledge through our weekly 99 Club. It is highly motivating for them, and there is a real sense of determination as they compete against their own previous scores, eager to improve each week.

Design Technology

In DT, the children explored seasonal fruits and learned how to peel and slice them safely using a range of equipment before constructing their own fruit skewers. A wonderful variety of fruits were brought in, giving the children the chance to taste items they may not have tried before. It has been a funfilled and busy term, full of important lifeskill learning and opportunities to broaden their experiences.





History and Geography

We have had an exciting term in History, learning about the Romans in Britain. The children explored the origins and expansion of the Roman Empire, focusing particularly on the reasons behind the Roman invasion of Britain and their eventual settlement here. They also examined the response of the Celts in detail and, were both enthralled and appalled by this significant historical event. The children learned about the importance of archaeological evidence and took part in thoughtful debates about the impact of the Roman legacy on Britain.

In Geography, we have now begun exploring the question, *“Who lives in Antarctica?”* In our first lessons, we revisited lines of latitude, map coordinates, and the location and climate of Antarctica—an extraordinary place in so many ways.

A homework task asking the children to research Antarctic explorers produced some truly inspired work. Well done, everyone.

Science

In Science, we explored Light and Shadows, investigating what light is, how it travels, and how shadows are formed. The children also examined a range of materials to determine

whether light could pass through them. This term, our focus shifts to plants, and the children will enjoy a wonderful visit to Waltham Place, where they will take part in hands-on learning in a beautiful natural setting.

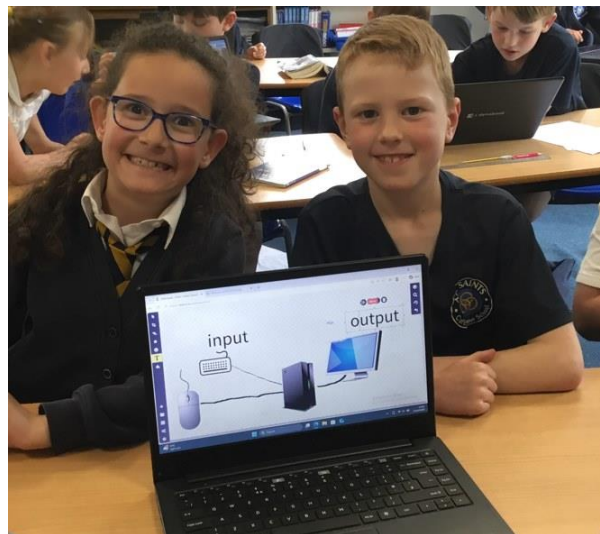


PE remains a firm favourite, and the children's enthusiastic participation in Sports Day was a wonderful testament to their enjoyment of physical activity. It was fantastic to see everyone taking part and doing their best to contribute points to their respective houses.

We have also had a great start to the term of swimming, with everyone eager to get into the water. The children impressed us with their speedy changing too — well done!

Computing

Computing has been particularly exciting this term and last, with the children exploring Scratch programming, as well as learning how to type and edit Word documents. While the Scratch activities were something everyone seemed to pick up quite quickly, the typing and editing skills certainly proved a little more challenging. All of these are valuable and relevant skills for children to develop. The children have also been learning about the 'Journey inside a computer'. This aims to give them a better understanding of how laptops and computers work, what inputs, outputs, information transfer, and algorithms are.





A thank you...

A word of thanks for your support with the new homework arrangements in Year 3. This has been a really positive shift, and we hope it will continue to be something the children feel committed to. We will always ensure that homework supplements and builds on the learning taking place in school.

Our current whole school attendance sits at 95.6%

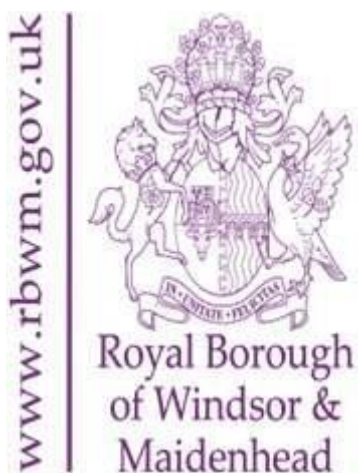
Nationally whole school attendance is 94.9%
