Spotlight - Owens

Last week Owens class examined an explanation text about staying safe in water. Here it is:

How to stay safe in water?

Going for an outdoor swim is one of the most enjoyable ways to spend time, especially during scorching hot weather. Unfortunately, many people don't realise how serious the difference is between swimming in a pool and in open waters like the sea or a lake. Therefore, it's crucial to be aware of how you can stay safe.

Why can water be dangerous?

There are many risks related to water, which can include:

- It can be very cold
- There may be hidden currents
- It can be difficult to get out (steep slippery banks)
- There may be hidden rubbish, e.g. shopping trolleys, broken glass
- There may be no lifeguards there
- It is difficult to estimate depth
- It may be polluted and may make you ill

Even though the water may look safe, always stop and think about the hidden dangers. If you're heading to an open body of water, remember our top five tips to help you and your friends stay safe.

Top 5 Water Safety Tips

1. Never Swim Alone

Swimming should only happen when a lifeguard is on duty so that there is professional help in case of emergency.

2. Enter the Water Feet First

Severe injuries can occur as a result of diving headfirst into shallow water. Due to the difference of temperatures between warm air and very cold water, you might experience a shock and breathing difficulties.

3. Stay Within Designated Swim Areas

Whether you're swimming in a pool, ocean or lake, staying within the designated swim areas is vital to staying safe.

4. Float to Live

Lean back and use your arms and legs to help you float. Consequently, you will be able to control your breathing and call for help or swim to safety.

5. Reach, Throw, Don't Go

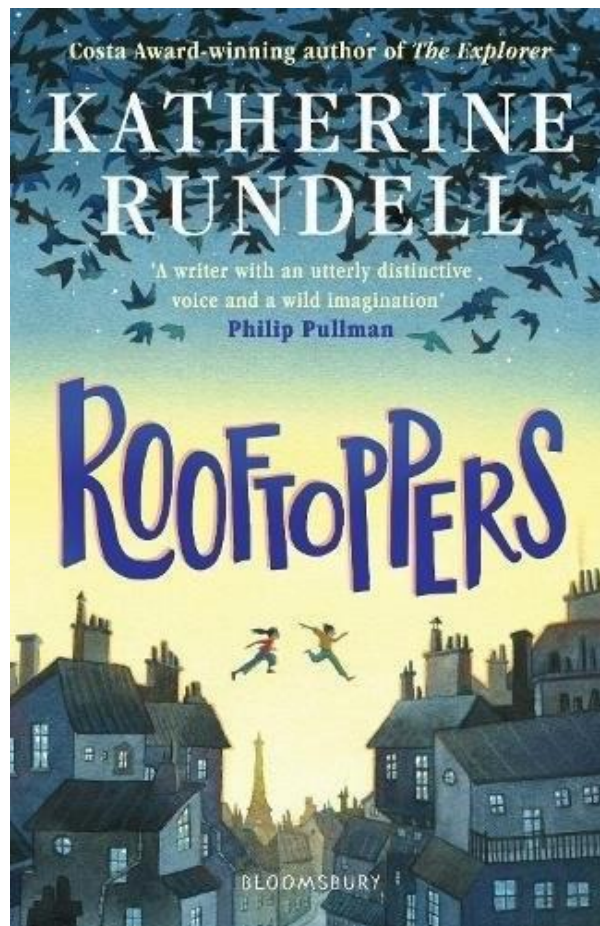
If you see somebody struggling to keep their head above water, use a long object to pull them to safety. By using this technique, you can save their life without putting yourself at risk.

Do you remember the Water Safety Code?

Spot the dangers. Take safety advice. Do not go alone. Learn how to help.

Now that you know what to do to stay safe in open water, you can safely enjoy outdoor swimming every time. Last but not least, if you see someone in trouble, call for help: 999 or 112.

In our Guided Reading lessons, Owens has started reading 'Rooftoppers', learning about the characters, settings and the plot.



In Maths, the children have started their new topic of 'Time' where the children will use multiplicative reasoning and related number facts to convert and compare the different

units of time. Our lessons will focus on: Years, months, weeks and days; Hours, minutes and seconds; Converting between analogue and digital times; Converting to the 24-hour clock and converting from the 24-hour clock.

In ICT this term we are investigating weather and looking at data handling. The children have searched the web to find temperatures of different cities and will learn how to input various weather data into a spreadsheet and be able to explain how this data is collected using sensor data systems.

In outdoor PE so far, we have been learning skills to play volleyball. We have spent two weeks learning volleyball skills, then we will spend two weeks learning badminton skills and two weeks learning tennis skills. Here are some action shots of our small games and then mini matches.





In Music, Owens has been learning how to read music to play their trumpets together. It really is remarkable!



In PSHE this term our topic is "Changing Me". Topics cover how we are all unique, learning about reproductive systems and discussing why people may decide to have a baby, changes during puberty, feeling confident and accepting changes and preparing for transition and looking ahead.
