My Child At School (MCAS)

As previously communicated, we are pleased to inform you that we are now ready to launch **My Child At School (MCAS)** an online portal for parents that enables them to



view their child's pupil information at school in real-time via the MCAS app or a web browser.

You will shortly be receiving an email from *MCAS* asking you to **reset your password**.

Please follow the link in that email to set up your account.

Once your password has been set, you will be able to access *MCAS* through the website www.mychildatschool.com or by downloading the MyChildAtSchool app, available free on both Apple and Android devices.

Initially, you will be able to access and view the following:

- **Attendance and punctuality** – check your child's attendance and report absences directly to the school through MCAS
- **School announcements and messages** – communications will be sent to you through MCAS
- **Student and Contact Details** – Check your child's details and make changes to address/telephone numbers etc.
- **Parental consent** – View and amend your parental consent options

· **School dinner preorder, balances and payments**- new for September 2026! School lunches can now be pre-ordered and paid for through MCAS, *not Tucasi*. Further details to follow.

ABLE TO ORDER AND PAY FOR SCHOOL LUNCHES

Spotlight - Aquino

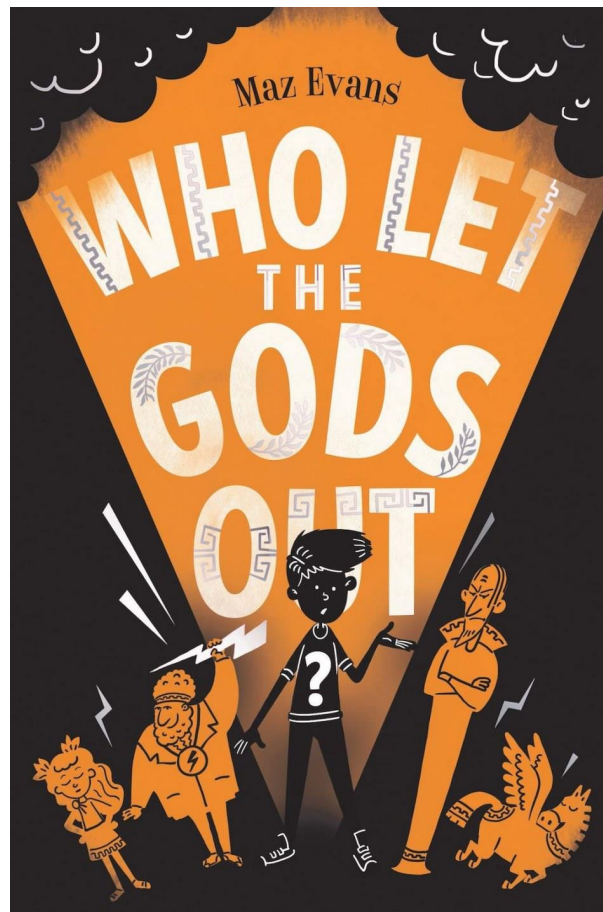
This is our final spotlight of the year, and I would like to thank all the children for making it a memorable one. They have worked consistently, remained engaged in their learning, and made an effort to do their best. It has been a good year, with plenty of enjoyable moments. This spotlight offers a brief overview of what has been a busy term. Well done to everyone.

Reading

This term, we began our new book, *Who Let the Gods Out*. The children have responded well to the humour and the exaggerated nature of some of the characters, alongside the more serious theme of how dementia affects families. We have also used the book as a starting point for additional learning.

As the story includes the imprisonment of a character beneath Stonehenge, we used this as an opportunity to research the monument and learn about the significance of the summer solstice.

We have also explored the Greek pantheon and considered the punishments given to those who offended the gods, including the story of Sisyphus.

In addition, the children should not have chose to do this despicable action and adding an unnecessary extra minutes to your amount of labour. Again, the classroom is very

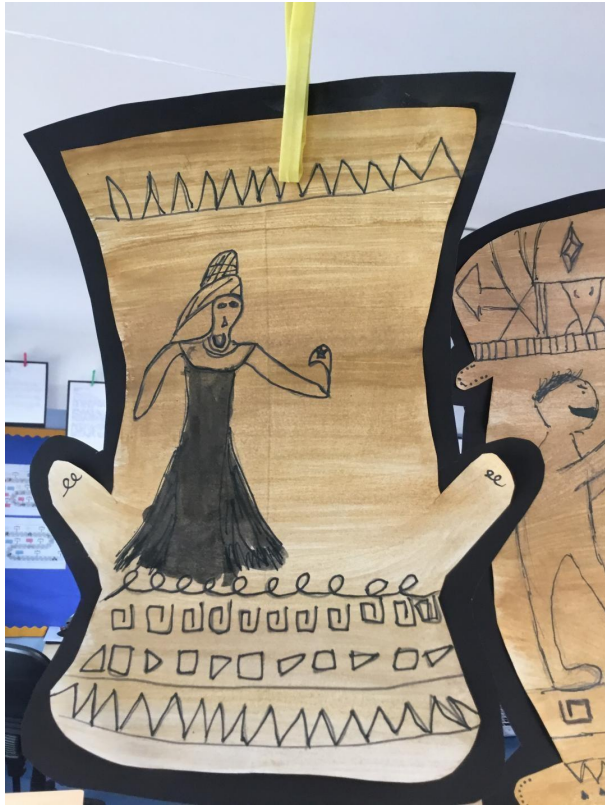
regretful and wishes not to do this again.

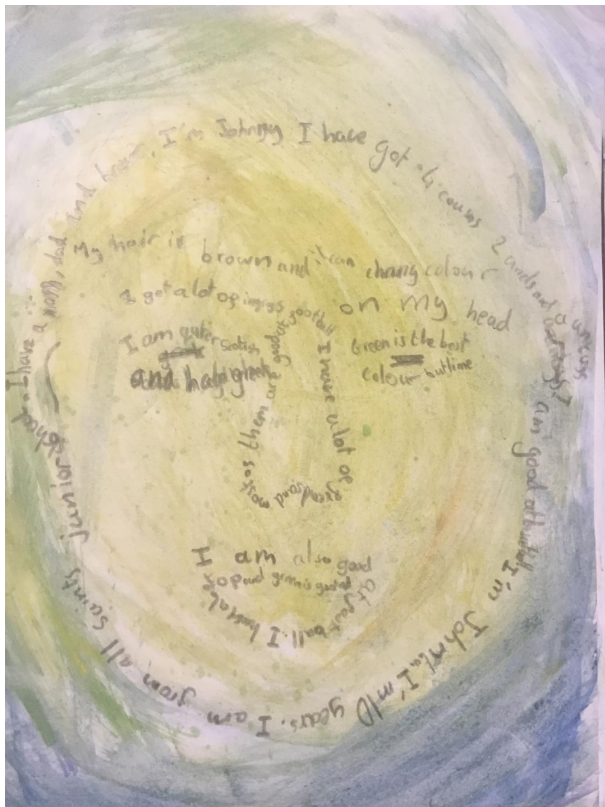


Community Day
