PE KIT - PLEASE NOTE

If your child has PE or a lunchtime sports club, they can wear their PE kit to school.

If your child has a lunchtime sports club, they are expected to change afterwards as they may get wet or muddy. If they have PE in the afternoon extra PE clothing is required. If they don't have PE on that day school uniform appropriate to the season should be changed into.

School Swimming and Water Safety Lessons

This term the children completed activities during Drowning Prevention Week. School swimming is very much educating children about water safety. Please do read the parent guide from Swim England and revisit it with your child as it may help over the summer. The guide is available on the website here:

Year 3 and 6 have come to the end of their swimming lessons at Newlands this term. Over half of year 6 met the expected level for the end of KS2 so please do consider maintaining their progression by going swimming regularly as....



by the end of year 6 children are expected to be able to swim:

- At least 25m
- Demonstrate a variety of strokes e.g. front, back and breaststroke.
- Perform self-rescue skills

Year 5 are swimming in the Autumn Term at Braywick, Year 4 will swim in the Spring Term, and we hope to repeat Year 6 extra swimming lessons at Newlands next summer.

If your child has not yet visited a swimming pool please consider taking them, they'll love it and it's a great family activity to share or progress to other activities like canoeing!

Older children will be painting Van Gogh's famous Sunflowers on canvas using acrylics. Our younger children will create their own version of the Starry Night in acrylics on canvas with step-by-step guidance from the artist. In addition, the children will create new homes for the birds in their gardens by painting birdhouses with their own creative patterns.

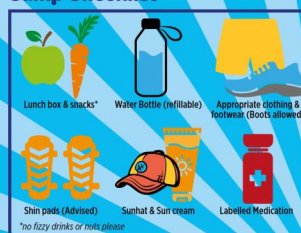

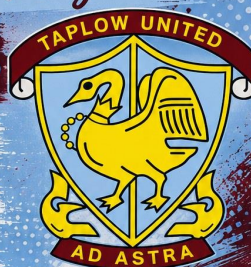
