Medication

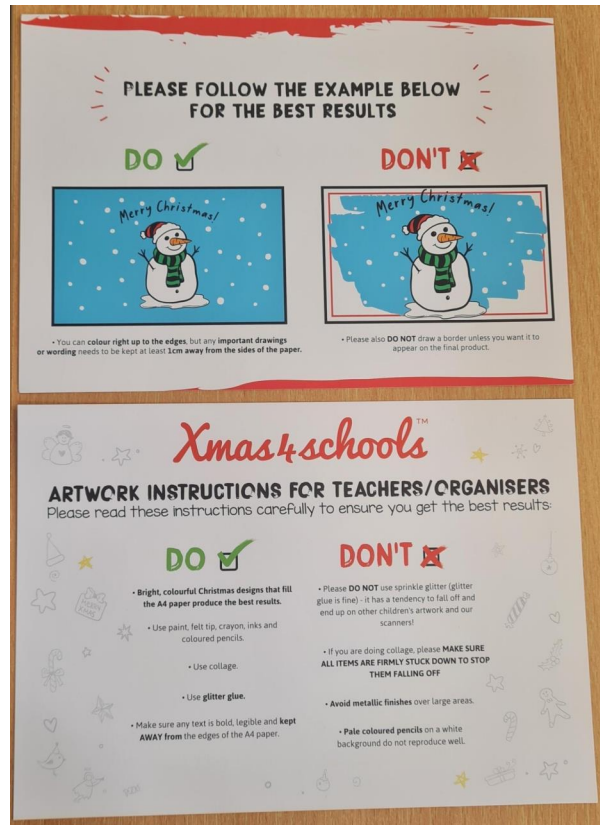
Dear Parents,
