We had sown six sunflower seeds in May, but only four of them have sprouted. In early June, we transplanted seedlings to the raised bed, but three of them got eaten, perhaps by a snail or a slug. It also could be a bird, a squirrel or a mouse. Now, at the end of July, we only have one sunflower plant left.

It grows in our last raised bed, which has the poorest soil and usually gets the least water. These can be reasons why our plants do not grow well there.

Next year, we are going to sow more sunflowers and start them earlier on a windowsill in our classroom. Also, we need to improve the soil, which is our target for Autumn term.
