

We have been very busy these last few weeks with all things books and reading!!!

First of all, we were incredibly lucky to have TWO virtual author visits for Years 4, 5 and 6, courtesy of Maidenhead's Big Read. On Friday 23rd February, Years 5 and 6 had the opportunity to meet the author Tom Palmer, who has written the book series **Football Academy** and **Rugby Academy** and lots of books based on World War 1 and 2, such as **Armistice Runner** and **D-Day Dog**. Class Spotlight - Aquino



It seems like only yesterday that it was our turn for a spotlight and here we are again. Just like last time I got the children to help me by commingling on their experiences and learning opportunities of just some of the activities that we have had this term and last. Varnikaa and S summed it up nicely, 'This term was amazing,' and I can't help but agree. We've had presentations from Authors, trips and visits and much, much more.

It is worth mentioning right up top about all the fantastic reading that has been happening in Class Aquino this term. We have four word millionaires in our class and more that are close. Keep it up everyone!

Maidenhead Fire Service came in and gave us a talk about fire safety, and a tour of their fire engine. Aquino properly grilled them. I personally was blown away by the calibre of the questions they asked such as: How far from Maidenhead do they travel in their job and how do you feel when confronted by fire? Along with being given lots of important information about how to keep safe in the home. Particularly, the importance of smoke detectors.









We have really been enjoying our class text too, The Explorer. We have been discussing how characters change and we are looking at the best ways to survive in harsh environments. As part of this, Mr Harris took the children out and taught them how to light a fire with flint and steel.





Science

In Science, the children set out a fair test recording how the friction in different surfaces caused objects to roll different distances. They headed out around the school testing any surface they could find and compiled their results in graphs and tables.











English


