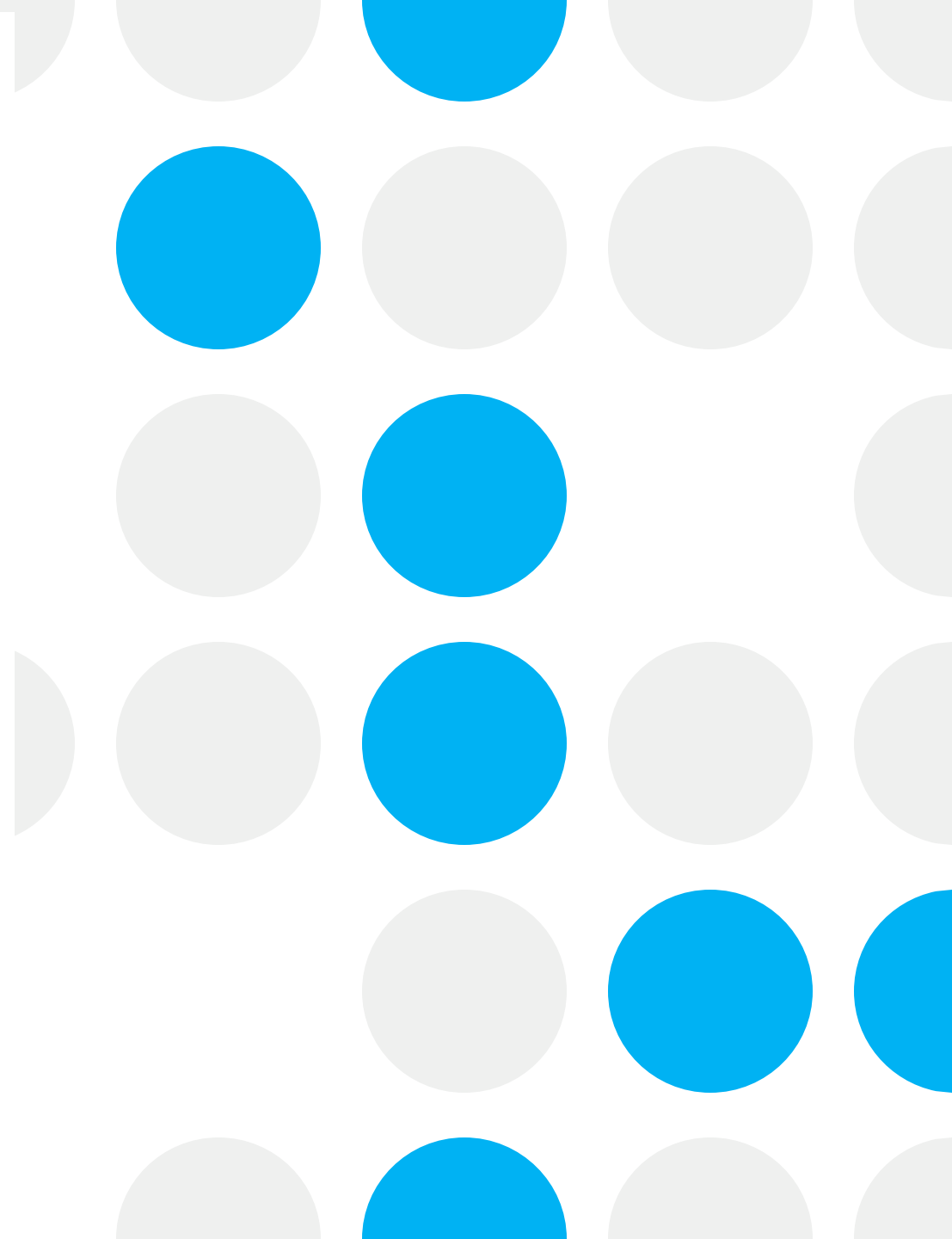

- *I love reading and enjoy watching (and participating if possible) in all sports!

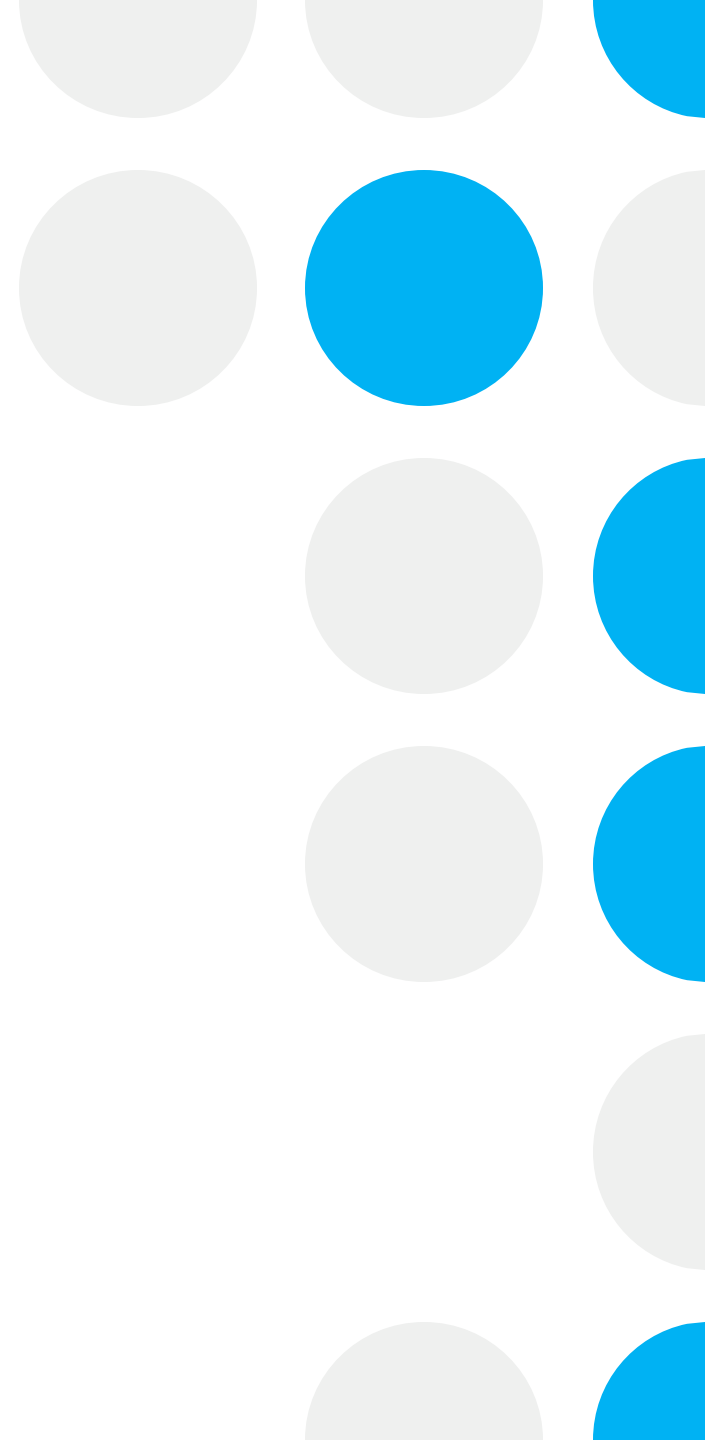

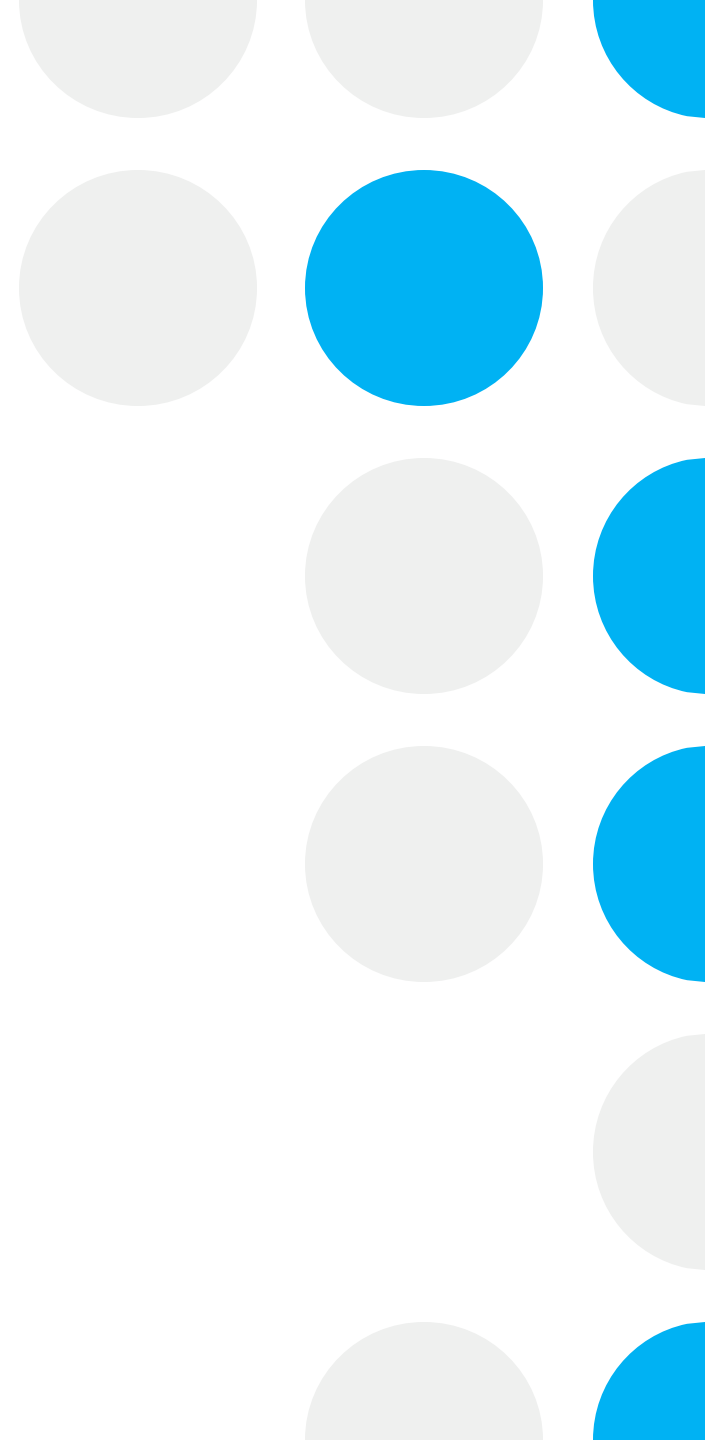
Axe Soup Text Map



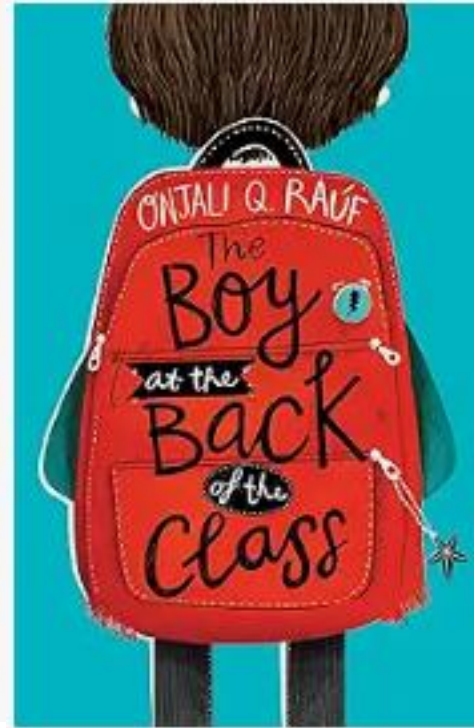
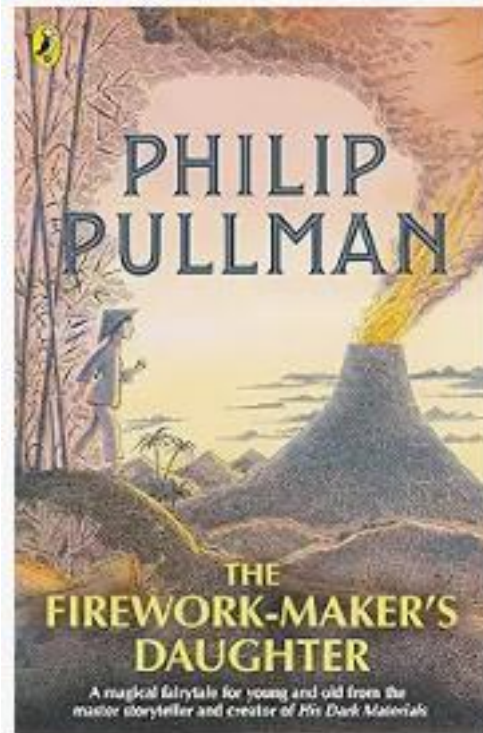
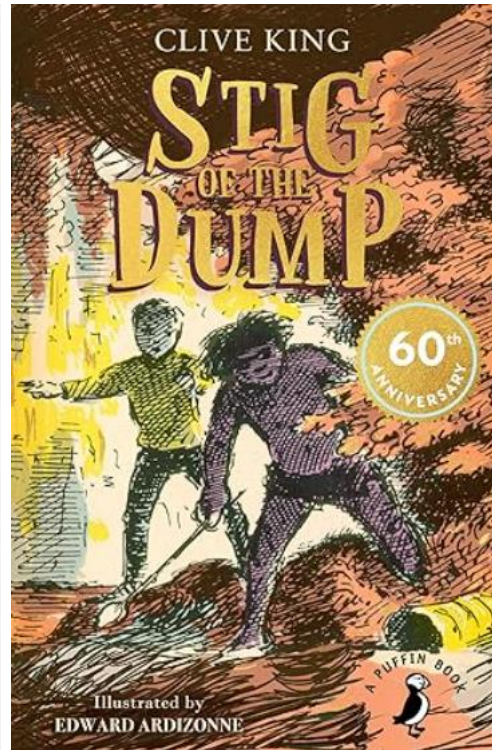
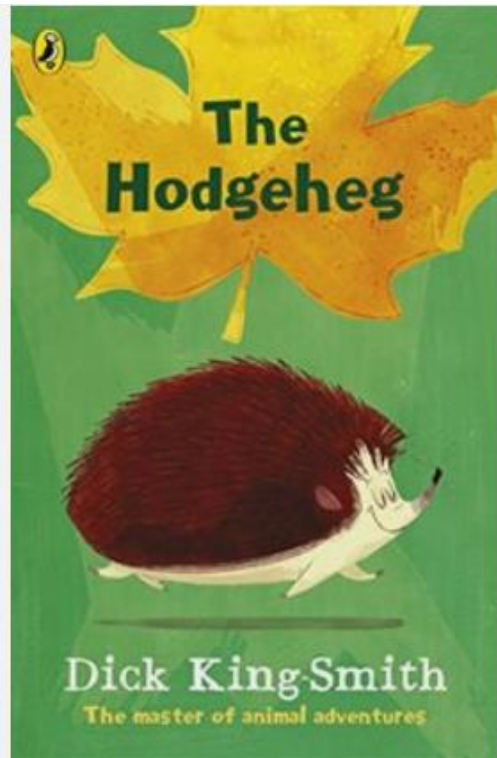

Spelling/phonics:



All pupils must know their set 1 – 3 sounds before moving onto spelling. Read, Write, Inc



In year 3 we will be consolidate their phonic knowledge. Every day 15-20 minute whole class sessions. In addition we have Fresh Start if required and Sounds videos to listen to.



Pupils will have opportunities to use their phonics sounds in all forms of writing.



Spelling and phonics are taught or referred to in all lessons. Spelling words will not be sent home in the first term.

Maths

- We will begin each unit by revisiting the Year 2 Ready to Progress Criteria
 - We will be focusing on place value, addition/ subtraction and multiplication/division.
 - Not about flying through the curriculum!
 - Opportunities to practice fluency and address misconceptions
 - About children learning not covering curriculum
 - Opportunities for challenge through problem solving and activities to apply knowledge at greater depth

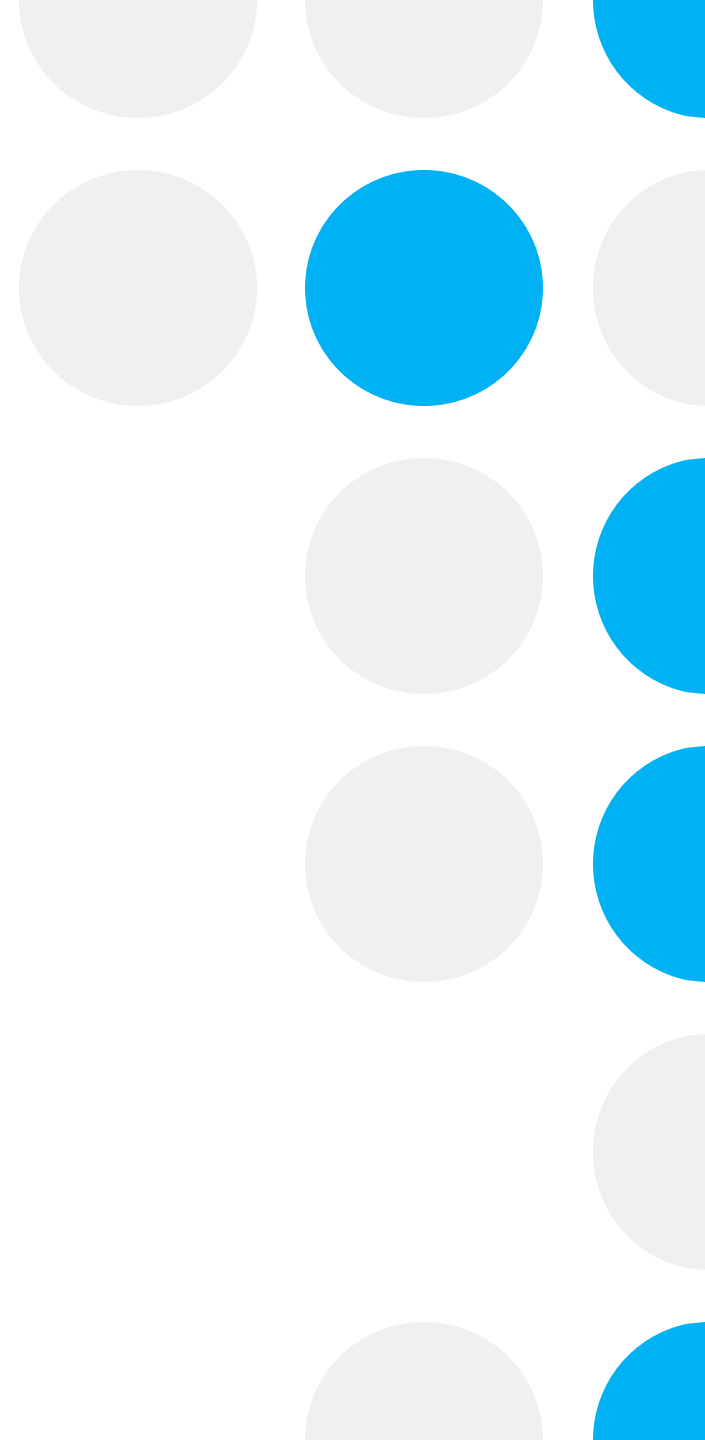

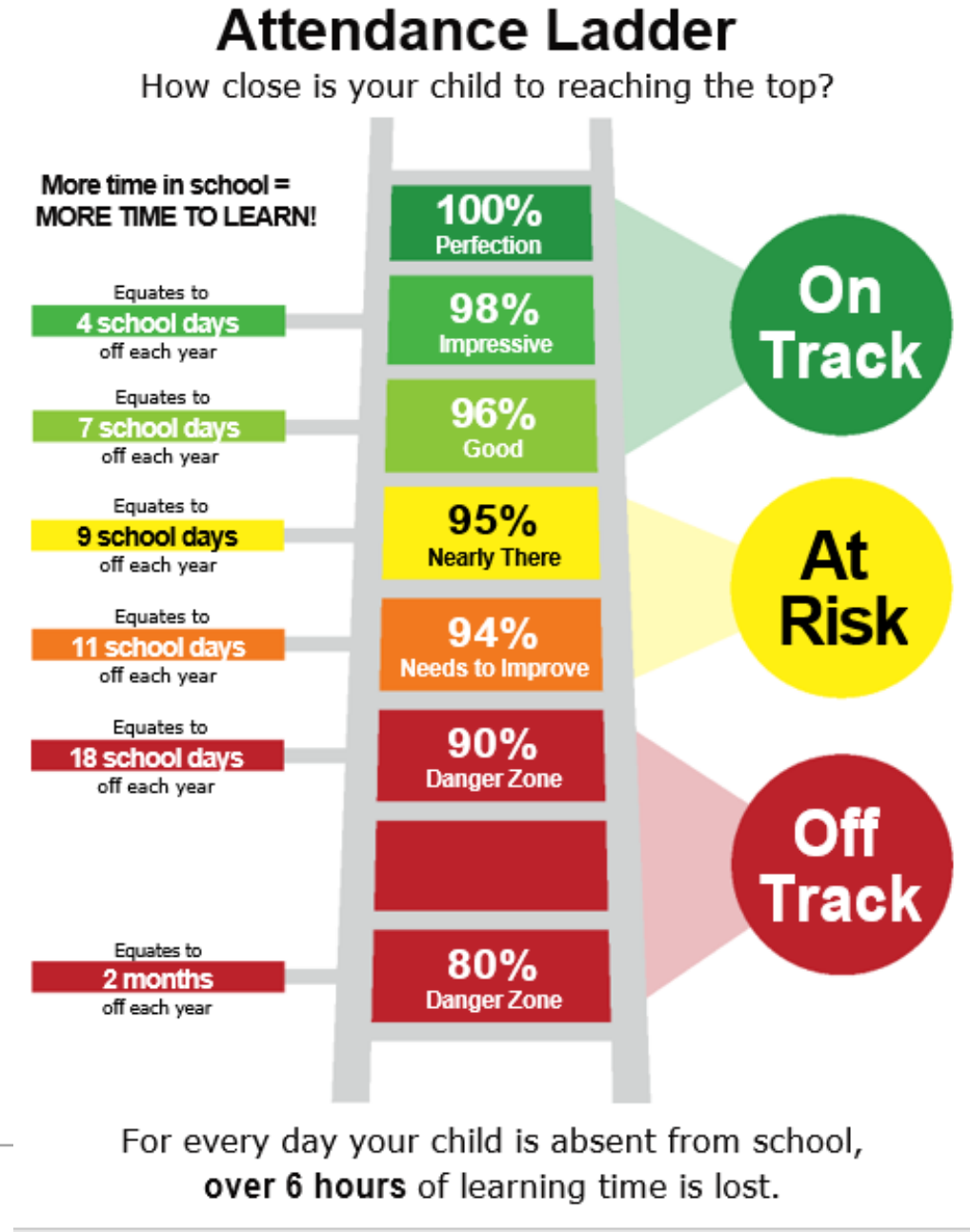
PE Days...

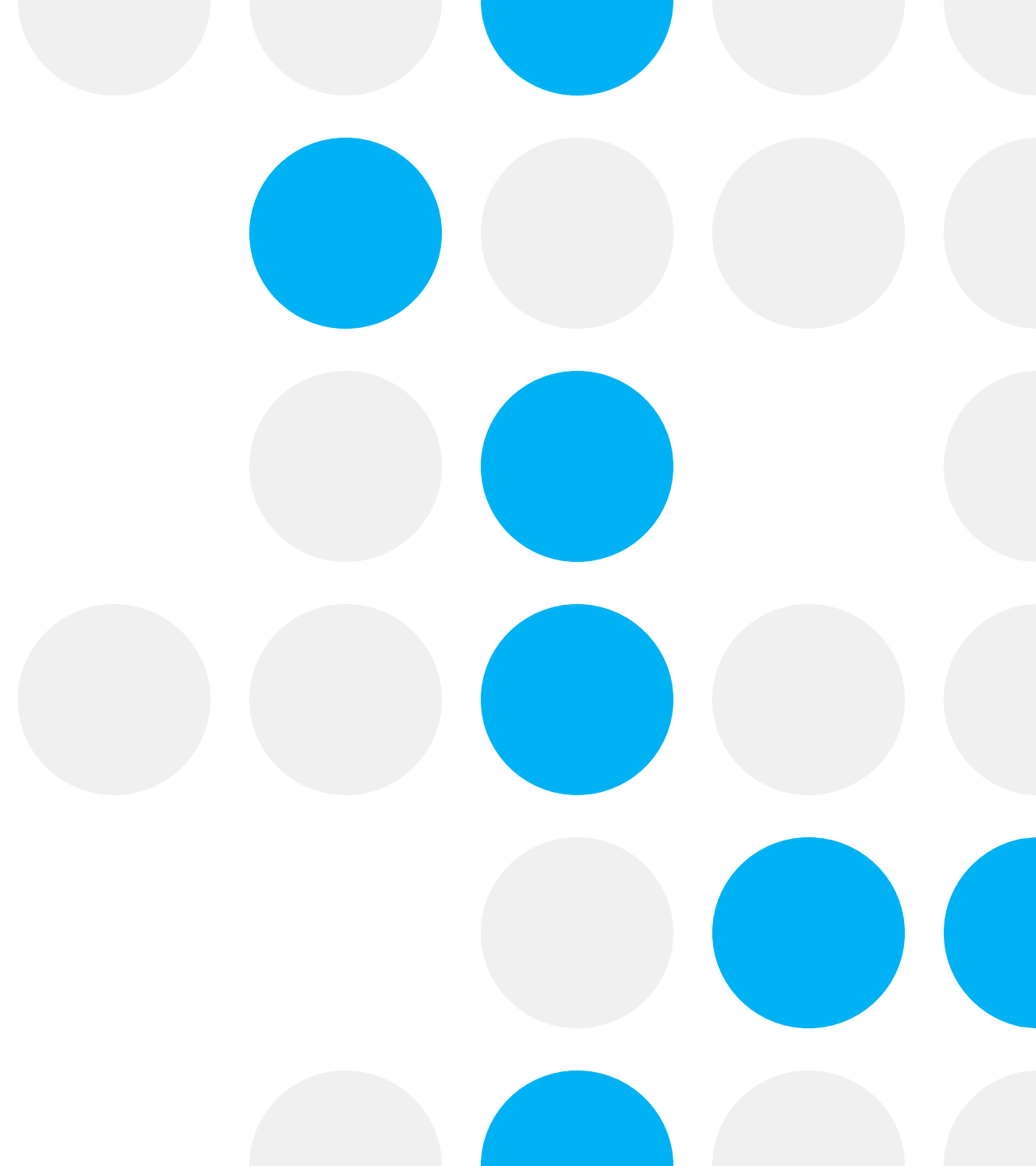
