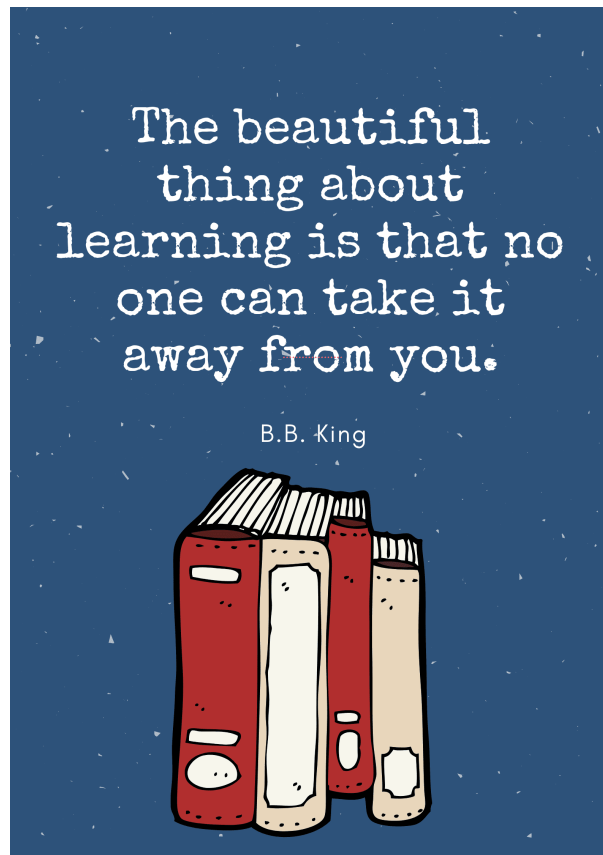

Dear Parents/Carers

This week, our school joined others nationwide to celebrate Safer Internet Day 2025, the largest global online safety campaign. This year's theme, 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online,' focuses on teaching children and young people how to identify and avoid scams, and highlights available support.

Scams can take many forms and target anyone, including young people. You may think that your child would be able to spot an online scammer, but the truth is that they are incredibly convincing and hard to spot. They often involve fake profiles and identities to target people. You may have heard this referred to as 'catfishing.' If your child has been targeted by a scam online and they have been made to do something that they didn't want to, then they are not to blame, they are not in trouble, and support is available.

We encourage you to join us in celebrating Safer Internet Day by continuing the conversation at home about spotting, responding to, and reporting online scams. Here are some helpful resources:

- What more can I do to help you feel safe online?

A key part of protecting children and young people from online harms is through preventative education. By talking about this in school and at home, we can all work towards keeping children safe when they are online. Celebrating Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity for you to re-emphasise the online safety messages we deliver throughout the year.

On Monday, Mr Green and our Digital Leaders led the school on internet safety and spoke about these particular topics to look out for. As always, they were brilliant with their delivery and very knowledgeable on the subject - Thank you! In addition we followed up in Wednesday's assembly about our own personal responsibility when online gaming and messaging.

Finally, for our year 5 parents - We will be holding our first meeting regarding the residential trip to Rhos-Y-Gwaliau on Monday 3rd March at 3.45pm in the main hall. This meeting will give you information about the trip including cost and how to pay. We highly recommend this trip for the children to build their self confidence, independence and to experience amazing outdoor learning activities. Please do come along even if you are unsure to get all the information you need before making a decision!

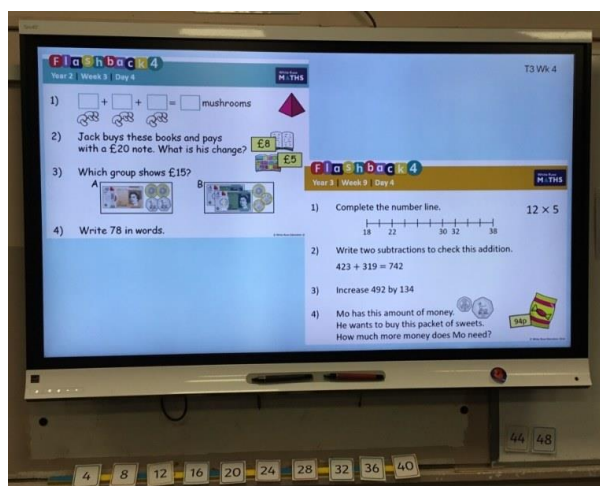
Class Spotlight - Shelley



Although a dreary, wet start to 2025, in Shelley Class it has been bright and busy. As you have already had some insight into a day in Lovelace Class, we thought we'd give you a sneaky peak into a day in Shelley Class (whilst celebrating wonderful work too).

Ready to learn...

Never a wasted moment, the children are welcomed into Shelley Class with morning work that consolidates and practises concepts already taught, some as far back as Year 2! Also, a good time to get a reading quiz done! A calm and productive start to the day as lunches are ordered, the register completed and, on a Tuesday with no assembly, the children are soon ready to go into their different phonics groups.



And the day kicks off...

In Phonics, the children continue to fill gaps in their sound arsenal where they are not secure in reading and using the correct sounds. The English language continues to challenge us all, and a lot of practise to use the correct sounds (and spellings) in words is something we take rather seriously. A very structured and fast paced 15 minutes... repeat, repeat, repeat, success!

and are collecting great ideas and vocabulary to include in their own independent piece at the start of next term.

Maths lessons start with learning times tables, and we are currently focusing on the 4-times table. I am sure the children might have mentioned Numberrock, some groovy times tables songs. During this short times tables focus, there is a lot of singing, chanting of multiples and spot questions to be answered. We are currently measuring length and the children are challenged with converting millimetres, centimetres and metres. Drawing straight lines to an exact measurement has been a particular challenge and one to practise more at home.

"Stig of the Dump" continues to captivate the children in our reading lessons. A magical story, classed as an 'archaic text', it certainly teaches children about another time (the early 1960s) and links in well with our Stone Age history topic at the start of the year.

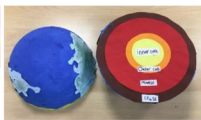
On a Tuesday afternoon, the children enjoy French and DT with Mrs. Shaheen. They have been particularly enjoying the Design and Technology topic named 'Electronic Charm'. It involves writing a program that initiates a flashing LED pattern on a Micro:bit when a button is pressed. A definite highlight!

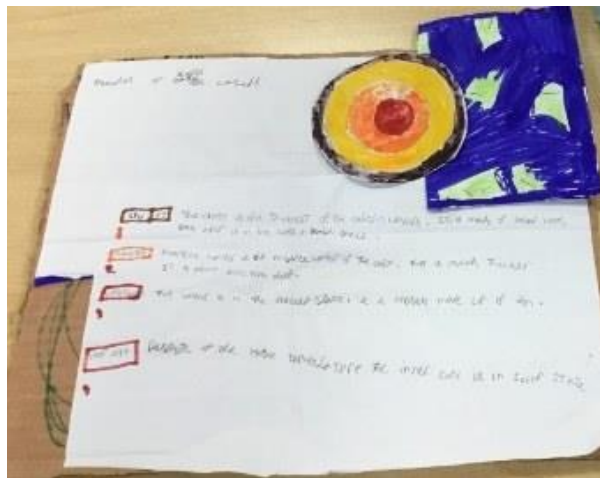


Homework Projects

Reading Update

- It's that time of year again when World Book Day is nearly here! World Book Day takes place on **Thursday 6th March** and we hope you'll join us as we come together to celebrate our World Book Day in school.
- This year, we have decided to hold a '**make a hat**' competition! All you need to do is create a hat based on a book/character from a favourite book – using cardboard and other recycled materials. Instructions on how to make a top hat will be sent home with your child before half term.

Your decorated hat must be brought into school by **TUESDAY 25TH February** and clearly labelled with your name and class.

There will be an overall winner from each year group and the prizes will be a £5 voucher to spend at the Scholastic Book Fair, to purchase a book of their choice!! The Book Fair will be at school from 26th February – 28th February 2025.

Here are some ideas for characters that you could create:



- **All Saint's Book Swap** – This is a perfect opportunity for children to trade in books they have already read for another book that will interest them. From **Monday 24th February to Friday 28th February** children may bring in used books that are in good, clean condition that they no longer want. For every **two books** they bring in, they will earn **one ticket** to be able to swap for a new book. (No more than ten book donations per child please). The Book Swap will take place on Friday 7th March, during the school day.

- Once again, we have the Scholastic Book Fair visiting our school. **The book fair will be located in the corridor outside the Year 6 classrooms and will be open from 3.30 to 4pm on Wednesday 26th, Thursday 27th and Friday 28th February.** This is a great opportunity for you to purchase some new books and the school also receives points which can be used to buy books for the school library. The children will visit the Book Fair, during the school day and will come home with a Wishlist. They will note down the book(s) they wish to purchase, with the price. These can be paid for using the QR code at the bottom of the Wishlist. **Please note: once payments have been made, send your completed wish list into school by Thursday 27th so that I can send the purchased books home with your child.** You will have to make payments, while you are at the Fair, using a QR code, which you will be able to scan using your phones and then make the payment by card. This will take you through to a payment website. **We are a cashless book fair so please remember your phones/card.**

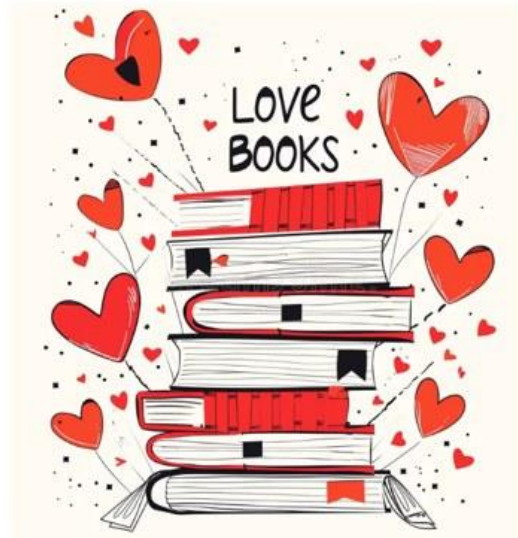
