## Priority Messages

Dear Parents/Carers

Incredibly we are into our final week of the spring term and looking back we have managed to pack so much in from school trips, curriculum themed days, sports competitions, sports matches, the Living Eggs for science week, Bikeability, World Book Day, Year 4 Easter service and many more! The children, as always, have worked really hard and continue to strive to achieve their potential.

Our year 4's are leading the school and parents for the Easter celebration this week. It really is lovely to hear the children singing songs as they practice for the celebration on Thursday. They will speak about the lead up in Holy Week and the importance of Easter in the Christian calendar. A big thank you to Mrs Morton and Miss Nowaczyk who have been guiding the children through the service and rehearsing the beautiful singing.

The final week has been a busy one with the children taking part in our 'Inter-house football tournament' where each year group teams up into their respective houses and play a football tournament. The matches were around 10 minutes long and was a great way for the children to experience competition and learn how to cope with the good and bad that comes with competitive sport! The children have had a great time taking part whether they play regularly or not, it has developed the children's understanding of working together and

playing as a team. Thank you to Mrs Thompson who organised the tournament and all teachers who ran the event in their year groups so well!



In year 5, to supplement the curriculum with safeguarding awareness, the children spent the morning with the local Fire Service to learn about fire safety. They discussed and learnt how to stay safe if exposed to fire, what to do if a fire breaks out, what can cause a fire and how they fight fires with the equipment they brought on site. It was a fascinating morning for the children and adults, who learnt a great deal! And crucially, had a go on the big hose!!!
