### ***Yellow Heat Health Alert***

---

The Met Office has not unexpectedly issued another **YELLOW** Heat Health Alert for the South East, which is due to last from midday tomorrow (Wednesday 18 June) until 6pm this Sunday (22 June). Yellow alerts are issued when the level of heat is likely to impact those particularly vulnerable (such as the elderly with multiple health conditions and on multiple medications), who're likely to struggle to cope. This means, therefore, that minor impacts are probable across the health and social care sector.

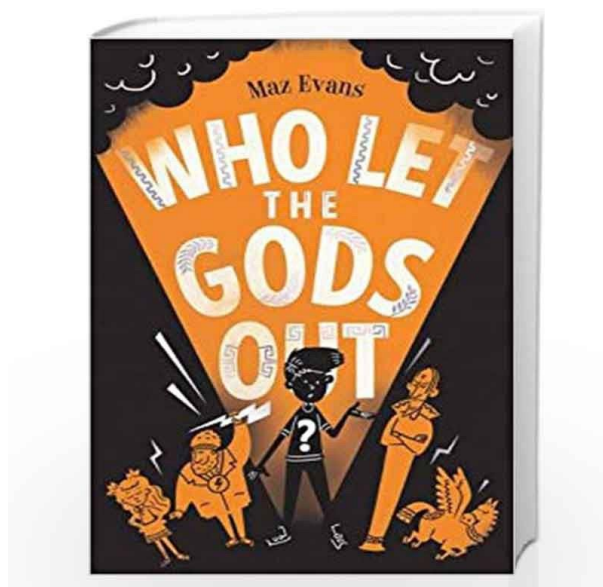

## *Pupil Premium Funding*

---

### **What is Pupil Premium funding?**

The pupil premium grant is funding to improve educational outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in state-funded schools in England. The funding rate in 2025/26 per eligible pupil is £1515 for FSM and Ever6 and £2630 for LAC or Post LAC.

### **Who Is Eligible for funding?**

The following groups are eligible for pupil premium:

- pupils who are recorded as eligible for free school meals (FSM) or have been recorded as eligible in the past 6 years (Ever6) including eligible children of families who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF)
- children looked after by local authorities, referred to as looked-after children (LAC)
- children previously looked after by a local authority or other state care, referred to as previously looked-after children (Post LAC)

### **How do we use the Pupil Premium funding?**

At All Saints, we use pupil premium funding to:

- support high-quality teaching, such as staff professional development
- provide targeted academic support

· tackle non-academic barriers to academic success, such as difficulties in attendance, behaviour and social and emotional wellbeing

#### PE Kit Reminder

It has been noticed by staff that some children are coming in to school in their PE kit when they should be in normal school uniform.

Please can we all be consistent with the rules.

All children should be wearing Summer uniform ( white polo shirt, shorts and a summer dress) from Easter until the October break, with Winter uniform ( collared white shirt with a

school tie ) from after the October mid-term break until the Easter holidays. All acceptable variations of this are detailed here: [All Saints Church of England Junior School - Uniform Information](#)

Children can come to school in PE kit ONLY on:

- designated PE days
- if they have a lunch club (Wed - girls football, Fri - boys football)
- if they have swimming in the Winter ( as shirts are not practical after swimming)
- if they are attending a sport event during school time

If children have an afterschool club they can be given 5 minutes at the end of the day to get changed ready for that club.

I have updated the PE kit reminder letter which will be given out to children who have not got the appropriate PE kit. I will also do the occasional spot check.

I hope this clarifies things for everyone so we are all consistent. It also portrays a smart image when we have visitors.
