Our aim at All Saints Junior School is for every child to Believe in their own abilities and those around them, to Grow and develop continually and to Achieve the very best they can.

We are seeking to appoint an enthusiastic, self-motivated Clerk to Governors to work in our school. The role of Clerk to Governors is to provide the Local Governing Body with efficient and accurate administrative support.

Key Accountabilities:

- To provide pro-active support to the governing body ensuring statutory compliance is maintained
- Liaise with Chair of Governors and Executive Headteacher to prepare agendas and distribute with supporting papers
- Record accurate minutes and distribute to governors
- Attend 6-8 Governing Body meetings during the school year (including some evenings)

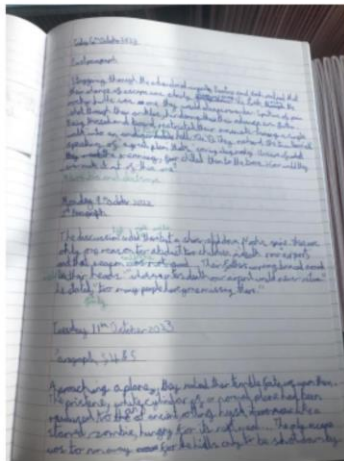
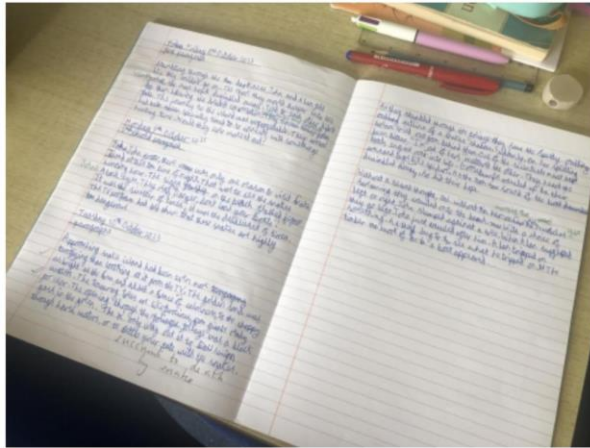

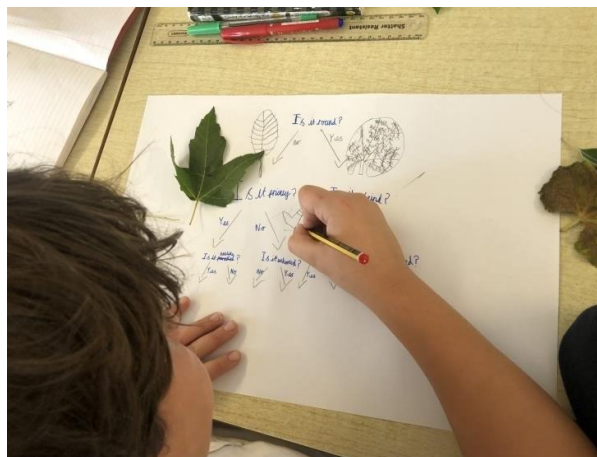

Hadid class has been working hard writing up our suspense stories based on the text Deadmans Cove. The children have been focusing on their editing skills and choosing each word carefully, for impact.



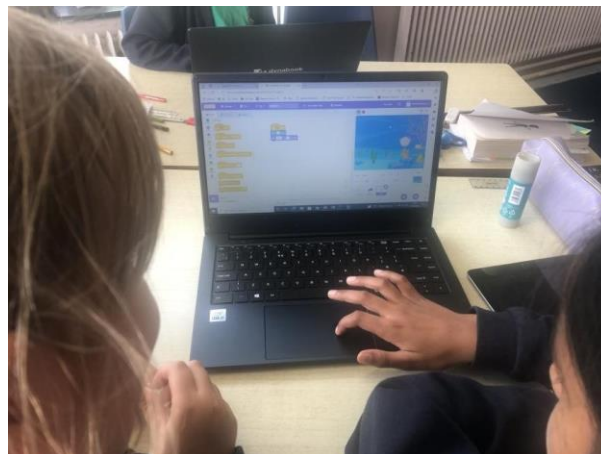
In science, we have been focusing on identifying different leaves from trees around the school grounds. The children have been creating branching diagrams to help identify based on the characteristics of each leaf.

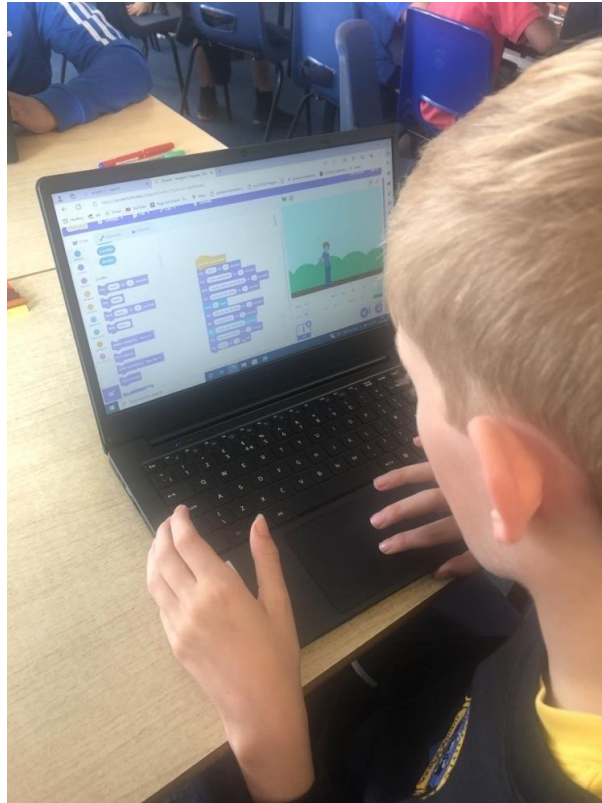


Some of our classmates attended a gymnastics competition at the weekend and brought in their medals to tell us all about how it went. Well done, girls!

We're back, after the resounding success of our AGM/Quiz Night last year!

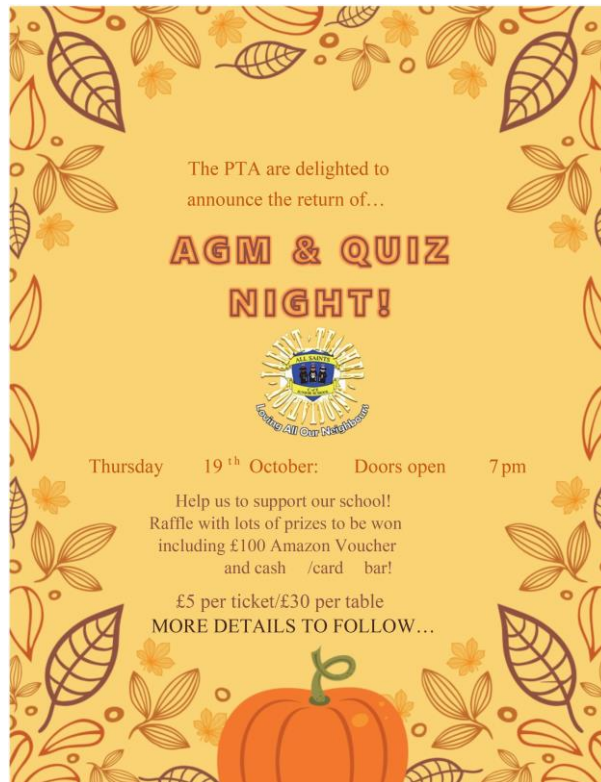
Come and join us, have a drink, enjoy an evening of fun for the grown-ups and support your PTA.
