Dear Parents/Carers

We have continued with action-packed weeks as our year 5's led the school in a community day. It was a lovely event organised by the pupils to raise money for our PTA - Mr Green has included a report below with a few photos as well!

This week our year 6's have stepped up rehearsals to get ready to perform to the school and parents next week. The children are very excited to perform the play 'Oliver With a Twist' to Boyn Hill year 2's and the rest of our year groups. Despite a few stressed year 6 creative directors (teachers!) the rehearsals are going brilliantly. Not only are the children fully engaged with the acting and singing but we also have a great team of children in charge of the technical side. We have children controlling the sound, lighting and props who are playing such an important role in all of this coming together.

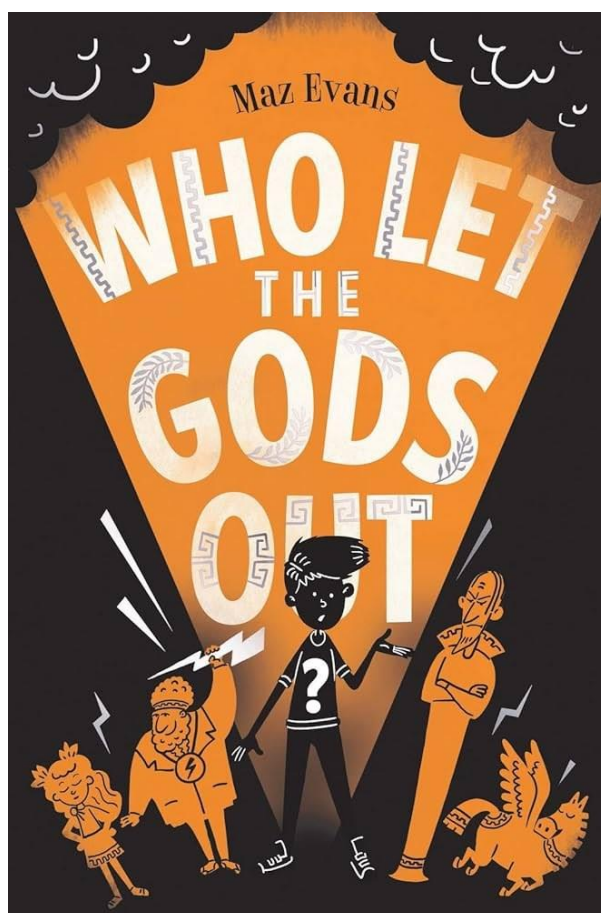
Class Spotlight - Aquino

Reading

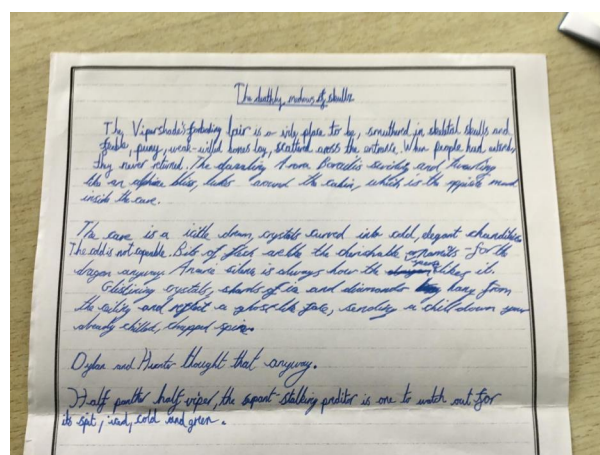
As the Gods in the book imprison someone beneath Stonehenge, we used this as an excuse to research into the ancient monument and the importance of the summer solstice.

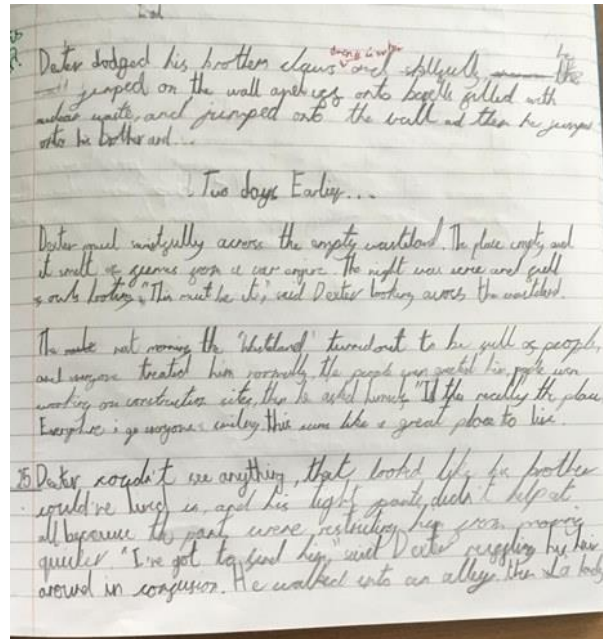
We've also looked at the Greek pantheon too, and the insane punishments that they dished out to those who have displeased them, like Sisyphus.



Writing

We have just wrapped up our latest creative writing task of a 'Slay the monster' story based on that of George and the Dragon. Here are some of examples:





We were also lucky enough to have local poet Simon Mole come in and work with the children to kick start our next poetry unit. The children were amazed by his rap-based performances and wrote and performed some excellent poetry using a rhyming pattern.

Mathematics

Aquino Class have been looking at measures, volume and capacity. We've been working with blocks to help us understand how volume works and having a great time drawing cubic drawings on isometric paper.

Science

We've been looking at seeds and germination this term. We tested the dimensions of different seeds by making our own paper 'seeds'.



History

This term we have been finding out about the Vikings. Were they invaders, traders or settlers? By studying a range of sources we've concluded perhaps all three.

Community Day

A big part of this term has been prepping and hosting our community day. The children have been beavering away creating posters; making products; baking delicious cakes and producing a multitude of other wonderful curiosities.

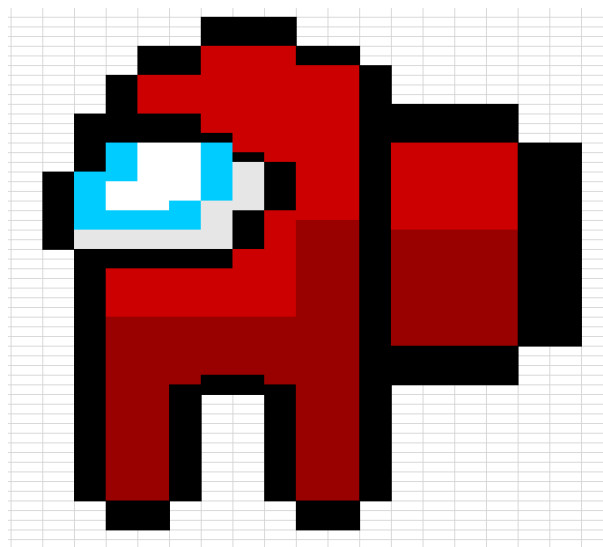
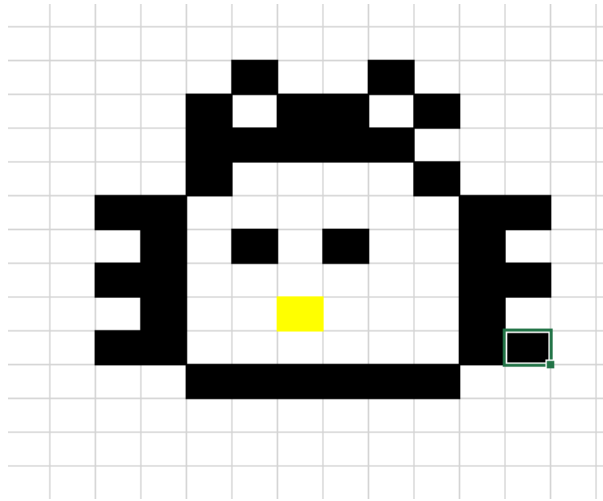


Computing


