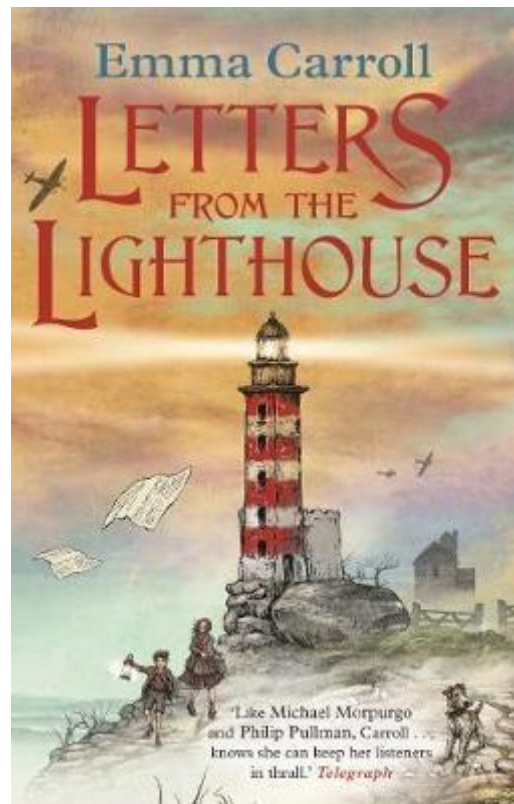
English

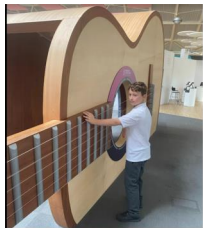
Reading
