ADHD Assessments - Right to Choose

Below is an introduction to the 'Right to Choose' service which supports parents/carers to get an assessment by an alternative provider as an alternative to waiting for CAMHS to do one.

'If you are based in England under the NHS you now have a legal right to choose your mental healthcare provider and your choice of mental healthcare team. This important right means that, for instance, should you decide the waiting time for your ADHD assessment is too long, then you can choose alternative providers. The provider must supply the service to the NHS somewhere in England. The providers we are aware of are listed below and we update the list regularly.'

Your child will be given a reminder note if they are not meeting the PE Kit requirements.

Afterschool Sports Club Routine

If your child is unable to attend a club after school, please inform the school office so your child can be accounted for.

If your child misses 2 consecutive weeks without explanation, their place can be offered to someone else. (This is only applicable to free clubs).
